



- To integrate in the students the ennobling virtues of truth, fairness, tolerance,


- accountability, and cooperation that lead them to serve the underprivileged.

FROM THE DESK OF THE TEACHER-IN-CHARGE

At the outset of presenting the annual report 2022-23 of our college, I extend my heartiest greetings to the honourable Chairman Mr Rajnikant Dani, Vice-Chairman Mr Miraj D. Shah and all the respected members of the Governing Body, Academic and Research Advisor, the Director General, Deans, Vice-Principles, Coordinators, teaching staff and support staff of the college and my beloved students. A short history of the voyage of the College has to be uttered before pronouncing the academic and administrative development of the college for the year 2022-23.

The Bhawanipur Education Society College (BESC) was founded in 1966 with the motto "Education for Excellence". It is run by the Bhawanipur Gujarati Education Society. It is a minority-run college recognised under section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC act, 1956, accredited by NAAC and affiliated to the university of Calcutta. BESC was created under Article 30(1) of the Indian Constitution, which guarantees linguistic

minorities, such as the Gujarati-speaking community in Kolkata, the right to establish and administer educational institutions. The college started its journey in 1966 with less than a hundred students, but in the decades since, BESC has sought to extend its motto to a truly diverse body of students, accommodating eligible pupils irrespective of their linguistic, religious, or financial backgrounds. Now, every year about 4000 students join the BESC family. At BESC, there is a wide range of academic pursuits and vocations directed to ignite the uninterrupted spirit of learning. There are 16 Degree Programs, of which 14 are undergraduates and 2 postgraduates. The programs are spread over three shifts, focusing on the academic streams such as Arts. Commerce, Science and Management. The college encourages the students to explore a carrier of passion while they work toward their degree.

Our college has constantly nurtured a vision to inculcate and promote the quality of academics and administration and implementation of the same through ISO certification. First ISO 9001: 2015 certification was done in January 2020. Since then, all the sections and departments are observed periodically to sustain the quality of their academic and administrative performances.

BESC is proud to have a team of faculty with highly experienced professional and personal skills of high order. Our family, both permanent and visiting, our committed to their students for their learning and mentoring process. They are very supportive in creating a conducive learning environment sharing their knowledge and skills to meet the requirements of a globally competitive environment and to instil social and ethical values among them. Our faculty is instrumental in updating themselves consistently for the UG and PG CBCS curricula and, NEP curricula through their innovative practices of pedagogy. I convey my heartiest congratulations to the faculty of the B. Com Morning Section for



their endeavour to create the B. Com Academic E-Library to store reference material for their students.

The faculty from all the departments are constantly motivated to pursue higher studies to obtain their M. Phil and Ph. D degree. The growth of BESC is continuously nourished by their constant research activity in campus or in collaboration with other institutions of high repute. Their regular publications of research papers, books, book chapters, e-Journals, review articles, periodicals, paper presentations in National/ International symposia, conferences, webinars, participation in the seminars, workshops, FDPs always testify to their high competency in nurturing and nourishing the minds of the students.

The BESC faculty of Science Section and the Arts Section also supplemented the efforts in publishing books with ISBN No: Coherence; Mosaics of a Locale; Vox Scholaris - Reminiscing History, E-Magazine; Thought Spell, Orateur with some meritorious students to explore their creative potential and innovative spirit in research beyond their curriculum. The department of English has published the E-Journal "Interlocutor" and the Science Section created a webpage for their journal "Coherence" in the BESC website, significantly putting a testimonial of the continuous research activity at BESC.

The 2nd cycle of NAAC accreditation process is under progress with the assistance of the IQAC committee of the college. The Academic Audit of each department is conducted yearly by the distinguished and eminent educationists from reputed colleges and universities as assessors on a regular basis to scrutinise the quality of academic activities in the college.

The green audit has been completed in due course.

The IQAC of BESC has taken the initiative to revise the Program Outcome (PO), Program Specific Outcome (PSO) and Course Outcome (CO) of all the UG and PG courses offered following the curriculum of the University. Distinguished and eminent personalities from reputed colleges, universities and other institutes acted as resource persons and delivered a series of lectures, organised by the different departments of the college through seminars, workshops, FDP, sensitisation programs on diverse disciplines for the students, faculty and staff members.

All the departments of the Science Section organised the "Peer Student Seminar" where the peer students presented papers based on their curriculum. Students of the department of History, Political Science and English presented papers on various topics on contemporary issues.

Our college seeks to boost up the online Teaching-Learning Platform SWAYAM-NPTEL as a learning resource for the students of their academic and beyond academic pursuits.

The college adopts various learning and evaluation methods for the students through classroom teaching, regular assessments, CIA, student seminars and remedial classes for the slow learners.

The BESC continue with the Graduation Felicitation Ceremony and felicitated a large number of sixth semester students in view of their excellence in the university examination.

On the auspicious day of Saraswati Puja, 2023, our college felicitated faculty members who have obtained their Ph. D. Degree recently. Faculty members are also awarded for publishing their research papers, books, book chapters in the various journals in the recent past.

The BESC management is especially thankful to the college support staff as they are the lifeline of the college and play a pivotal role in its growth. The management took the initiative to felicitate the support staff including the security and housekeeping staff, the academic support and the Accounts, Sports, Infrastructure, and the

Taking into consideration the new subjects in all disciplines to be started and the increased number of students being admitted each year, the college proposes to extend the academic block in near future. There exists a generatorbased power backup in the college to maintain uninterrupted power supply. Water coolers cum purifiers have been installed in each floor of the building to ensure safe drinking water; fire extinguishers have been provided in all the laboratories, library, offices, staff rooms, corridors, sports arena and in all other places as a safeguard against fire hazards. CCTV cameras have been installed everywhere in the college to strengthen the security system. One infirmary is always active for the service of ailing staff and students. There are a total of 68 lecture rooms all of which have multi-media projection facilities, one smart classroom, 32 laboratories (includes 6 new laboratories and 1 research laboratory, four computer laboratories). Facilities for differently abled staff and students in accordance with the Government guidelines, one air-conditioned Auditorium, two centrally air-conditioned theatre halls, conference and seminar halls of the college all have state of the art multimedia facilities. The college has 302 desktops, 32 laptops (each department has laptops for their need), and 01 server room. The computer laboratories are equipped with the latest software meeting the needs of the students for their curricula. The entire college campus is a Wi-Fi enabled zone. The college also has 6 lifts (a new one being added last year) to ensure the barrier free movement for all staffs and students.

The college library termed Knowledge Resource Centre is well equipped with books, periodicals, newspapers, reference volumes and national and international journals covering all subjects of study offered at the college. The digitally enabled Knowledge Resource Centre extended facilities like Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) (through which Registered users may check their library accounts), e-resources (Capitaline DataBase; Jstor; Pearson E-Library 2.0; Inflibnet, Nlist etc.) everything for students, staff and faculty need, conveniently available on campus in an air-conditioned, digitally connected space. Individual departments also have a separate library for the instantaneous usage of books. This year our library enlisted Pearson E-library 2.0 where 8355 books/ journals of all disciplines are added. Furthermore, our library started one new section as Collegial Repository where each programme repository contains programme syllabi, rare books and journals, question papers, special lectures, in-house journals and culture and heritage related documents of the college and our endeavour is to provide the library membership to all the support staff of the college with the encouragement of the Management. Our very proactive library staff and the faculty associated with the library committee are always there to upgrade the infrastructural facility of the library. They offer paid internships to students through 'Earn while you learn scheme' that gives them hands-on experience in library functionality and of working in a professional environment. Another excellence of our library services is that the best library user award was started for the students and staff in 2019 based on the footfall count in the library and resource usage and is still being continued.

Being an undergraduate college affiliated to the University of Calcutta, the college administration explored all possibilities for the placement of the passing out students. BESC has achieved an extremely high placement record over the years from many top national and international companies. Every year, the Placement Cell draws recruiters from the like of TCS, EY, PWC, Deloitte, Oracle, Axis Bank, KPMG and Indigo, to name a few. BESC students have been placed in Amazon, Ernst & Young, ITC Hotels, Cognizant, Byjus, Eureka Forbes, ICICI Prudential Life Insurance, Hoichoi, Indigo, Paisa Bazaar.com, Phone Pe and



TCS. In addition to handling placements, the Dean of Students' Affairs conducts a series of seminars, workshops and a good number of professional skill development courses on entrepreneurship and leadership for the outgoing students of multi-disciplinary sections of the College. Our counsellors are always at hand to talk with students about emerging trends in global and local hiring practices in the field of their choice. I take the opportunity to thank our students and the splendid placement cell of the college that in spite of post Covid-19 crisis, the cell organized placement drives where students found placement for job/internships. Many companies have already shown their interest in visiting the placement cell of our college.

Now, let me state some of the notable achievements of the college in the department of Games and Sports during 2022-23.

GOVERNANCE

The Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson have been highly active with an inspirational mind. The duly appointed Teacherin-Charge is responsible for the implementation of the vision and day to day functioning of the college. The Teacher-in-Charge is assisted by the Rector, Dean, Vice-Principal(s), Coordinator(s) of each section of the college and the Bursar, the administrative officers in each section (Office/Accounts/Infrastructure/System Control Room) and a well-powered Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college with a wellstructured administrative setup. 



- Brief description of the event: The Department of Commerce (UG and PG) and the Department of Business Administration (BBA) of the Bhawanipur Education Society College conducted a Seminar on "Union Budget 2023-24" on February 6, 2023 at the Concept Hall, of the main campus of the College. Students from various departments such as BBA, B.Com and M.Com registered for the event in large numbers. The registration began at 1:30 pm and in less than half an hour we had a packed house. The Seminar began with Prof Dilip Shah, Dean of Student Affairs welcoming the august gathering formally. He introduced the Dignitaries, Moderator, and Faculty, and invited them to light the lamp. He then invited



the Speakers and Moderator onto the stage to take their seats. Thereafter Prof. Shah handed over the proceedings of the event to the Moderator, Dr. Suman K Mukerjee, Director General, BESC. Dr. Mukerjee explained the areas to be covered by the speakers based on their expertise. He shared the key points of the Budget 2023-24 highlighting the highest growth rate India had achieved overall in developing nations. He said that the Budget truly integrated the economy and had the vision to link the major areas of economic activities - on the Rural front and the MSME Areas. It addressed issues concerning tribal groups, SCs, STs, Backward classes, and OBCs and in that way was a "Bharat jodo" economic plan. He reiterated that contrary to popular belief, the Indian economy is in fact performing fairly well globally as compared to many other developing nations that have moved from resilience to resurgence and Fiscal consolidation to counter-cyclical fiscal policy stressing on IRGD (Interest Rate-Growth Rate Differential). He referred to it as a document that, while outlining the government's revenue and expenditure for the upcoming fiscal year, sets the direction for inclusive economic growth and development through social overhead capital. Dr. Ashok K Lahiri (Economist, Former Chief Adviser member of the 15th Finance Commission) spoke extensively on the budget thrust and



the importance of the primary deficit. He also spoke about growth and stability, Fiscal prudence, and sustainability of debt. He also explained that "all receipts are not revenue" and interest payments are not expenditures. Next, CA Lion A.P. Singh (Chartered Accountant and Vice President of Lions Club International) spoke on the "Amrit Kaal" which refers to the next 25 years up to 2047. He spoke on what this budget will provide and the importance of developing the infrastructure. health, education, and family welfare in India. He also spoke about the fiscal deficit and the danger it poses to our economy. He concluded that the future would depend on the youth and their ability to make rational decisions. CA Harish Agarwal (Managing Partner, EY, and COO for the consulting service line of EY India) was optimistic about where we can expect India to be in the next 25 years. He delved into the intricacies of foreign investments and the modified personal Income tax regime. He also spoke of the need to increase the women's participation rate and the vital role women need to play in promoting Indian economic growth and not just attending to domestic issues. Next, CA Dinesh Agarwal, (Partner EY, India) spoke briefly about the effect of Direct taxes and rationalization of measures in the country. He explained the difference between the old and the new Personal Income Tax regime and the

rationale behind it.CA Avisekh Jaiswal, (Partner EY, India), spoke on the concepts of Indirect taxes. He mentioned the importance of GST as a contribution to Indirect tax, Central Excise Duty, and Customs Duty which are as yet concurrently in vogue. It is a matter of time before all Indirect taxes are integrated under one head.CA Arun Agarwal (Chartered Accountant and Partner, K N Jain) spoke on the signalling and thrust of the Budget. Being an expert on Service Tax, he gave his thoughts on the relevance of input tax credit in the current Budget. After all the panelists had delivered their presentations, the Moderator quizzed them on the reduction in MNREGA expenditure, the relevance of Farm Bills when rural development is crucial, and Health, education, and other socio-economic indicators. Thereafter, some questions were invited from the audience, and it was heartening to see students and faculty exhibiting a great deal of curiosity to ask very relevant questions. The speakers aptly answered the questions with a lot of interest and enthusiasm.

 Outcome of the event: The session covered the key points of the Budget, highlighting the major areas, which need attention for a developing nation like India. It gave insights regarding rural development, fiscal prudence and sustainability, importance of youth and women, new personal income tax regimes, relevance of input tax etc.

- Objective of the event: To familiarize students with computing technologies that had been developed in ancient India and can still be applied successfully as a substitute for modern computing techniques.
- Brief Description of the event: An Invited Lecture organized by the Department of Economics for the students and faculty of the Science Section, titled "Conventional to Classical Computing", was delivered by respected Professor Kashinath Dey, ex-Professor of the Department of Computer Science and Engineering, University of Calcutta. The program started with a felicitation of the dignitary on-stage, following

which the Dean of Students Affairs of the college, Professor Dilip Shah, shared his thoughts on the topic. The immersive lecture delivered by Professor Kashinath Dey consisted of little details of Vedic Mathematics and some of the sixteen sutras of the Vedas. Every sum presented to the undergraduate students was dealt with simple diction and ample clarity by him. The importance of Vedas, Upvedas, and Vedangas in classical computing, and how their texts contained mathematical concepts that formed the core of Indian, and later, world mathematics and sciences, was talked about at length by Prof. Dey. He displayed some methods of performing basic subtraction and multiplication using techniques of computing that existed hundreds of years before conventional methods were thought of. Concepts of Ekanyunea Purvena and the importance of Sthapathyaveda, which, plainly put, is modern-day engineering, were expounded upon by him. The reason behind '9' being called a 'magic number' was explained thoroughly by the distinguished teacher. He went on to talk about digital roots and their significance in classical computing, and how they can be used in today's world to further simplify mathematics and science. Squaring numbers, or multiplying extremely large numbers, can be made out in a matter of minutes, if not seconds, using basic Vedic mathematics. At the end of the lecture, Dr. Ivy Dasgupta delivered her vote of thanks and concluded the event.

 Outcome of the event: The students learnt about various methods of solving complicated problems in mathematics. The Professor emphasized on rigorous practice to get acquainted with those procedures, which might seem complicated to a first-timer, but invariably gets easier with repeated application. He accepted questions from the audience pertaining to his lecture, after his presentation ended. Questions were asked by both students and teachers which were answered very promptly by him. It can be seen that the event created huge interest among the participants in learning such computing techniques.

Subsequently, Prof. Tathagata Sen, IQAC Coordinator delivered a brief speech on the pristine pleasures conjoined with manual

handling of resources at traditional libraries.



Dr. N. C. Ghosh's presentation was titled "Understanding Metrics for measuring the Impact of Scholarly Communications". He began with a brief contemplation on the evolution of changes in the medium for recording scholarly communications. Subsequently, he introduced the audience to several nuances of scholarly communications, namely its definitions, channels and cycles. An integral portion of his lecture was devoted to various modes of estimating the impact of scholarly publications in online academic communities; some fundamental varieties of impact include article impact, journal impact, author impact, book impact and book chapter impact. Dr. Ghosh spoke of various softwares capable of generating journal citation reports which provide scholars with transparent, publisher-neutral data and statistics. The presentation focused on some appropriate modes of estimating the impact of a particular journal, some of which would include the SCImago Journal Rank, Impact per Publication (IPP) and the Immediacy Index. The lecture concluded with a reflection on possible strategies to maximize the impact of scholarly output in online scholarly communities. Dr. Ghosh's presentation was followed by a brief Question-Answer round, which was succeeded by a fifteen-minute tea-break.





At 12.45 pm, the second session of the workshop resumed with the presentation of Dr. Pritam Gurey which was titled "Similarity Detection: An Important Approach towards Quality Publication ". The presentation began with a reflection with a definition of plagiarism and its considerably wide range of manifestation, not only in scholarly publications, but also in film posters and music. Direct plagiarism, patchwork plagiarism. paraphrasing plagiarism and unintentional plagiarism are some of its variants. Dr. Gurey spoke at length on the different formats of citation which is an indispensable practice for tackling plagiarism. Subsequently, he demonstrated with the aid of pre-recorded screenshots how various plagiarism-detection tools such as Turnitin and Ouriginal operate—this provided a revealing insight into the handling of plagiarism-detection tools to the members of the audience. The presentation was followed by a Question-Answer round where members of the library staff. Committee members and students directed their queries to the speaker.

The Vote of Thanks was delivered by Ms. Piu Chatterjee. The entire workshop was ably conducted by Dr. Dona Ganguly. The "Effective Use of Library" workshop has served to enrich the academicians and students of the Bhawanipur College by making them betteracquainted with modern technological advancements in the field of digital archiving and



handling of digitized academic resources.

G. SEMINAR, WORKSHOP, CONFERENCE, FDP, etc., CONDUCTED BY THE OFFICE OF THE DEAN OF STUDENTS AFFAIRS

1. Event Name: How to Prepare a CV Date: 06 August, 2022

The Bhawanipur Education Society College organised a workshop on 'How to prepare a CV' in collaboration with the TIMES Institute on August 6, 2022 at the Jubilee Hall. The speakers were Mr. Siddharth Mallick (an alumni from IIM Kolkata). Mrs. Prachi Mahajan (an alumni from SP Jain India) and Mr. Inder Chopra (Faculty Member of T.I.M.E Kolkata) who came together and explained the importance of CV in a person's professional career as an essential piece of personal marketing to promote yourself to an employer so that you stand out. They discussed why before preparing the original one, a person should prepare the 'Master CV' which contains their lifelong achievement as it helps them prepare for interviews. They also said that it is always a Smart way to customize CV according to the field of work and always make important points in bold and to the point as a recruiter does not even give more than 20 seconds to a CV. They even advised students to add years to make CV more disciplined as it shows continuity and

persistence. More than 100 students attended the workshop, and it was especially beneficial for final year students who would be appearing for interviews for jobs or even for higher studies.





2. Event Name: How to Crack an Interview Date: 08 August, 2022

The Bhawanipur Education Society College organised a workshop on 'How to Crack an Interview' with a goal of giving students a unique learning experience which fosters their ability to manage themselves during strategic interviews. The workshop was held at the sixth floor Jubilee Hall, on 8th August 2022 from 10:30 a.m. onwards. The orientation was inaugurated by Mr. Dilip Shah, the Dean of Student Affairs. Ms. Prachi Mahajan an alumnus of SP Jain India and Mr Inder Chopra an alumnus of IIM (kolkata) were the speakers of the day who made sure to guide everyone about the different types of interviews such as freewheeling, stress and miscellaneous interviews. They also discussed a few different types of questions such as Ice- breaking, Behavioural, Traditional Questions, Case Questions, Role-play Questions, Industry-specific Questions, Brainteasers and Performance -Based Questions. As a lot of candidates face difficulty in an interview purely because they do not understand which type of interview they are appearing in. Depending on the interview you are a part of, your answers, concentration levels, preparation, interpersonal skills, and responses

need to vary. The workshop provided innumerable information and professional guidance on interviews projecting yourself as the right candidate for the profile you have applied for, which was beneficial for the final year students to find out the tips to tackle tricky interviews.

3. Event Name: Public Speaking Workshop Date: 10-15 August, 2022

From the 10th of August, 2022 a public speaking workshop was conducted at The Bhawanipur Education Society College by Ms. Samiksha Khanduri, who is an educator and author. The workshop was conducted over a course of 15 days, each session of two hours and divided into 2 separate batches of students (11 am - 1 pm and 3pm - 5pm). 30 students, mostly 2nd year and 3rd year undergraduates participated in the workshop. The main aim of this workshop was that students should feel comfortable communicating in public and forming interpersonal relationships. The event started off with some interactive games which made them familiar with the idea of public speaking, like 'On Me Now', where students had to talk about things



they are wearing or carrying with them at the moment, namely their personal belongings. Another such activity was 'I have a Dream ', inspired by Martin Luther King Jr in which students talked about their aspirations and life goals. 'Spotlight effect' was an activity dealing with issues like stage fright by making students talk about their weakness, this was also dealt with using a SWOT analysis. The first hour of the session was about the various principles and basic concepts of public speaking and the next hour for interaction with the teacher where they tried to articulate their opinions about different things. The students were further encouraged to talk about their issues through one-on-one sessions with Ms. Samiksha Khanduri. The last day of the workshop was about 'stage presence and the preparation for delivery of speech' where they eventually gave a speech, hence fulfilling the objectives of their training. The students received a merit certificate from the college on successful completion of the workshop.

After the theoretical aspects, the speakers explained to the students the application procedure of Python. This was followed by a doubt clearing session and then a vote of. It was an enriching experience for the students.



6. Event Name: Commerce Lab 2.0 Date: 02-12 September, 2022

After the huge success of 'Commerce Lab1' the Department of Commerce Morning, of The Bhawanipur Education Society College, came up with the sequel named 'Commerce Lab 2.0'. It was a 10 days informative course to assist students and give them an idea of the corporate world. The





main goal of this course was to provide practical insights into the workings of the corporate sector. The event began on 2nd September 2022. CS Jyotirmai Mishra, President of ICSI Bhubaneswar Chapter was the Guest of Honour and the event was inaugurated by Mr. Dilip Shah, the Dean of student affairs of the college. On the First day of Commerce Lab 2.0, CS Sneha Raut shared the practicalities of appointing an independent director in a company. CS Palika Aggarwal discussed TDS compliance, which includes a form to be filled within the stipulated time, deducting TDS rates. CS Raksha Jhunjhunwala showed the relevant forms for appointment and dismissal of manager and discussed how to fill them. The concept of DIN (Director Identification Number) was also discussed. On the second day of Commerce Lab 2.0 summary of IBC and its impact until date with respect to case studies were mentioned by CS Arani Guha. How the operations of a government company square measure dead and managed was highlighted by CS Deepa Jhunjhunwala. The importance of Digital upskilling for the scholars and the way it adds worth was discussed by CA Ekta Mishra. The alternatives for raising funds by the business were mentioned along with due diligence of business transactions by CS Sneha Sharma. On day 3, the rules for reserving a name for a business using the RUN portal on the MCA website were covered by CS Mohammad Minaz. CS Yashraj Agarwala highlighted the subject of

LLP incorporation by demonstrating the pertinent forms that must be completed on the MCA website. The GSTR 1 and GSTR 3B forms were explained by CA Karan Kothari. One the fourth day, CS Joydip Chakroborty spoke about the SEBI Listing Obligation and Debt Regulations 2015 and businesses listed on stock exchanges. CS Anita Dutta provided insight into the idea of MSMEs and their advantages, and the appropriate URL was displayed for MSME registration. CA Gopal Khetan spoke about the subject of mergers and acquisitions, including instances from real-world situations and their advantages. CS Binita Pandey spoke on the benefits of creating an LLP (Limited Liability Partnership) agreement. On the fifth day of Commerce Lab 2.0 CS Ishant Jain discussed how to establish a business personality while outlining certain dos and don'ts. CS Tanvee Srivastav talked to the students on the appointment of independent directors and showed them the appropriate websites. CS Pammy Jaiswal gave the students advice on how a corporation might raise money from sources like shares, debentures, etc. Rahul Maheshwari spoke about how the Indian Stock Market operates and provided some advice on how to interpret market data. He also listed some resources that could be used to view market data. On day six, CS Kanchan Pandey covered how to access a listed company's public documents on the stock market website also website for BSE was suggested. CS Nitin Dabriwal spoke about GST registration and the procedures that must be followed. The practical elements of the AGM were explained by CS Kritika Mohata. On the seventh day, CA Swati Singhania instructed the students on how to produce financial blogging material and profit from it. The event started with the host welcoming the guests on the stage, Prof. Chiranjib Bhattacharjee - Pro Vice-Chancellor, Jadavpur University, Mr. Arindam Sil -Actor & Director, Mr. Riddhi Sen - Actor along with the Director General of the college, Dr. Suman K Mukerjee were welcomed for the lamp lighting ceremony. The event was initiated by the Vice Chancellor of Federal Bank, Mr. Santosh Kumar who welcomed all the guests in his talk about the 'Speak for India' contest. His exclusive TedX talk on the trinity of career counseling made him an ideal fit for discussions around making Careerrelated decisions. He took an inclusive approach to a wide spectrum of problems, by drawing a contrast between the GenZ & his generation, where the former has an abundance of career choices in comparison to the older generation. Asking the students about their idea of career planning he drew various allusions to explain how students should choose a career that suits them, instead of trying to fit into a career. The second speaker of the day was Ms. Nikita Jalan, a Senior Counsellor with 7+ years of experience in psychometric assessment, clinical diagnosis, and Psychotherapy in various organizations such as the Institute of Neuroscience & Medica, Kolkata.



Her talk revolved around the emotional wellbeing of young adults and how to deal with parental issues at home. She even addressed the issues of relationship building amongst young adults who often face stress, anxiety, and depression due to lack of attention. 21. Event Name: Management Studies in India and Abroad

On the 17th of March 2023, The Bhawanipur Education Society College organized a Seminar on Management Studies in India & Abroad. Mr.





Dilip Shah, Dean of Student Affairs enlightened the students on the stress one undergoes in selecting colleges while planning for Higher Education. The first guest of the event, Mr. Ratan Kumar Mukherjee, General Manager, Operations from Global Reach having 32 years of association, laid emphasis on Business Schools situated outside India. To keep up with the changing trends, The Bhawanipur Education Society College organised a seminar in collaboration with Larson & Toubro EduTech. The students of AON (Assembly of Nations) organized a MUN workshop, "Learn to MUN" for two days in the Society Hall from 12 noon to 2 pm. The workshop was conducted by the secretary general of The BESC AON'23, Hreed Gupta who is currently a student of Economics at the college. He has been a part of the Kolkata MUN circuit since 2018 and has also been a delegate and EB in 30+ MUNs, combined. The first day of the workshop commenced with a speech delivered by Mr. Dilip Shah. Then, a presentation was shown that demonstrated the importance and working of the different organs of the UN. Harsh Sharma, an experienced delegate of the Indian committee explained the significance and functioning of the Indian committees. He also discussed the search process required to be followed for competing in Indian committees. The attendants raised their questions and clarified their doubts. 24. Event Name: Protecting Yourself from Cybercrime

Date: 23 March, 2023

As part of the CSR initiative, ICICI Foundation was invited to The Bhawanipur Education Society College on March 23, 2023 to make the students aware of Cyber Crimes, Mr. Mainak Chakraborty, a Financial Consultant at ICICI Foundation CSR Banking, was felicitated by Mrs. Minakshi Chaturvedi, Coordinator, Morning, Department of Commerce. Mr. Chakraborty began the session by asking the students how many online frauds they have heard of. The students were then made aware of the Jamtara scam as well as how Cyber Crime is at an all-time high in Kolkata. The students were familiarized with terms used in the Cybercrime industry which makes innocent people their victims. The participants were told about the ways in which one can protect themselves from Cyber Crimes like Phishing Links, Vishing Calls, Juice Jacking, Money Mules, Pyramid schemes, etc. Students particularly found the one on Juice Jacking informative, where using Public Wi-Fi & charging in plug points at common spaces, might lead one to financial





fraud. Things like Document forgery were also discussed along with helpline numbers to reach out to in case of financial fraud faced by them. The speaker vividly gave details of the process by which one can reach out to customer care numbers and raise tickets online when they realize they have become a victim of Cybercrime. The session ended with two videos on fraud in online transactions & how scammers work in such a way that naive people easily give in. Towards the end, the session was wrapped up with the view that one must become conscious of not sharing their bank details, google pay UPI numbers unless asked by Banks themselves.

25. Event Name: Seminar on Chat GPT and Al Apps

Date: 24 March, 2023

A seminar on Chat GPT & Al Apps was organised on March 24th, 2023, at the Society Hall of The Bhawanipur Education Society College. The first speaker, Mr. Dipak Kumar Singh, a highly experienced and skilled Data Scientist, Chartered Accountant, and Certified Forensic Professional with over 11 years of experience in the industry, began the session by speaking on Chat GPT. The next part of the seminar was taken up by Mr. Animesh Das, a Serial Entrepreneur & Brand Strategist with more than 10 years of experience in brand & product-building. Mr. Animesh began the session around memes &

how they are created, further he showed more than 20 odd AI applications to make the creative work easier. All the other AI apps discussed by him were relevant to various industries like content creation, designing, sound design, animation, etc. He explained how the vacuum in jobs across industries can only be filled by skilled AI professionals as the world is heading toward complete automation.

26. Event Name: Workshop on Business Ideation to Implementation

Date: 31 March, 2023

The College organized a Business Ideation to Implementation workshop on March 31, 2023, in the Society Hall. The workshop was conducted by Dr. Sudipto Bhattacharya, a Certified Entrepreneurship Educator from STVP, Stanford University, and a Professor of Innovation, Entrepreneurship, Marketing Management, and Strategy, Dr. Bhattacharya began the workshop with an interesting activity where he distributed threads of equal lengths among the students and asked them to tie them around their hands, find a partner and tangle their threads in a way that seemed impossible to get out of it. Dr. Bhattacharya emphasized the importance of teamwork and how an entrepreneur must select a team where the strength of a member would complement another's weaknesses. He also highlighted the fact that the idea for a business lies within an individual, but the demand for that idea is in the market around us. Dr. Bhattacharya further explained that understanding the target audience's needs is critical before working on a product. He also highlighted that every individual thinks differently when it comes to solving a problem, and that is why diversity in a team is essential. The speaker introduced the students to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and how entrepreneurs can build a product to solve one or more of these SDGs. Dr. Bhattacharya cautioned the students not to share their business idea with anyone without signing a Non-Disclosure Agreement (NDA).

Come, Converge, Collaborate – with this motto The Assembly of Nations 2023 was inaugurated on 27th April at 3.00 pm in Jubilee Hall. The AON was initiated with very graceful classical dancers who performed, giving out a thoughtful message that no matter how many wars happen between countries, there can only be peace if there's unity



and consensus amongst each country of the world, Dr. Suman K. Mukerjee, Director General introduced the concept of a MUN & the Chief Guest in his eloquent address. Further, the Teacher in Charge of the college, Dr.Subhabrata Ganguly was called upon to felicitate the Chief guest, Mr. Manfred Auster who is the Consul General of Germany. Mr. Auster then took the dais and spoke about the international relations between Germany and India. He spoke about the fact that despite some flaws in the current UN setup, the UN is a very valuable part of the international rules-based order and that the Charter provisions are key to world peace. Day 1 was an opportunity for everyone to interact with each other so that all participants understood the dynamics of the committees and the discussions to be kickstarted smoothly from Day 02. The Second Day of MUN began with a great spirit of enthusiasm and competence, the delegates proceeded towards the committee proceedings as scheduled. There were a total of seven committees namely: Rajya Sabha, United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), The Joint Chief Of Staff's Committee (JCSC), United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (UNCSW), United Nations Human Right Council (UNHRC), United Nations General Assembly-Disarmament and International Security Committee (UNGA-DISEC) and International Press Committee (IPC). On Day 1 the Committees discussed issues ranging from cross-border trafficking of Weapons of mass destruction to the decriminalization of homosexuality under Section 377 of the Indian Penal Code. They also brought global issues like linking climate change to agriculture and the impact of it on food security and issues of gender equality to the discussion. On Day 3 of AON, the college street play group, "Antarjal" performed & after that, all the delegates moved to their respective committees to begin the 3rd day's proceedings. They also highlighted the key evaluation factors including content and creativity, leadership skills, and communication approach (verbal and non-verbal), which determine the performance of MBA aspirants during GDs. Additionally, they emphasized the importance of thorough preparation, which includes gaining knowledge on a wide range of topics, staying updated with current affairs, and honing one's communication and presentation skills. Overall, the speakers conveyed their expert knowledge of MBA by extensively discussing the significance of GDs in evaluating candidates. The organizers challenged the participants with fun quiz activities related to the field of Mass Communication. This guiz involved games like, Guess the jingle, Guess the brand logo & Guess





the Brand Ambassador. Participants were shown partial or distorted versions of famous brand logos, and they had to identify the brand associated with each logo. This activity tested their visual & audio recognition skills and knowledge of popular brands in the mass communication industry. The quiz on guessing the brand ambassador tested their knowledge of brand endorsements and celebrities associated with specific brands. About 50 students participated in the event. 36. Event Name: Equity Research Date: 06 June, 2023

The BEST collective of the Bhawanipur Education Society College organized an informative session on equity research, led by the esteemed speaker Mr. Aswini Bajaj. The session, held on the 6th of June, took place at the Jubilee Hall, and drew an impressive attendance of over 250 students. The primary objective of the event was to provide attendees with a profound understanding of how expert equity researchers analyze companies for investment purposes. The event commenced

Furthermore, he elucidated the disparities between trading based on tips and genuine trading, while emphasizing the necessity for individuals to educate themselves before venturing into this field. Moving forward, Mr. Bajaj delved into the fundamental aspects of equity research, enlightening the audience on how to approach the analysis of a company for investment purposes. He discussed the financial details of Asian Paints as an illustrative example, dissecting both annual and quarterly reports, conference calls, and equity research. He imparted his insights on how to scrutinize these reports effectively, enabling participants to discern whether a particular company is suitable for investment. Towards the conclusion of the session, he opened the floor for an interactive Q&A session, allowing attendees to seek clarification on any doubts they may have had. This engaging exchange of ideas fostered a deeper understanding of equity research and provided attendees with valuable insights into the investment analysis process.



- Brief description of the event: The Department of Political Science of The Bhawanipur Education Society College organised a Students' Seminar on March 27, 2023 where students of the sixth semester of the department presented academic papers. The seminar focused on multifarious topics on various contemporary issues of both national and international importance. Papers were presented analysing the impact of public





sector policies like the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MNREGA), Ayushman Bharat Yojana.  Brief description of the event: The department of psychology of the Bhawanipur Education Society College organized a seminar on "Freud and Everyday Psychopathology" to commemorate the 167th birth anniversary of Sigmund Freud on 6th May 2023 at Jubilee Hall from 12.30pm to 1.30pm. 


CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES DURING JULY 2022 – JULY 2023

34. Event Name: Theatre Fest Date: 05-07 April, 2023

Keeping up with its tradition of imparting holistic education and all-around development, the Bhawanipur Education Society College held its 8th edition of the Theatre Festival for 2023 from the 5th of April 2023 to the 7th of April providing theatre-loving students with a stage to showcase their talent. Since 2016 it has been the only 3-day festival of theatre in West Bengal, which boasts of 13 colleges from Kolkata coming under one roof of the college to perform in 8 separate competitions related to one or the other form of theatre. On day 1, at the inauguration ceremony, the theme of the festival "Speculo: I within Eye" was disclosed by the Dean of Student Affairs, Mr. Dilip Shah. The ceremony also saw the felicitation of Ms. Moubani Sarkar, BA English (Hons) Semester IV, who won Gold at the State Rowing Championship by members of the management Sri, Jeetu Shah and Sri, Umesh Thakkar, To begin the Three-day fest, the Flames team of the college presented a dance performance. The first event was the Audio drama (Suno Kahani)





which marked the beginning of the three-day journey of the Theatre Fest. 7 colleges participated in this event and the judge was Ms. Pratigya Ghosh. The winner of this event was the main team of BESC, Aarohan, with the 1st and 2nd runners being The Heritage College and BESC Antarjaal. On the same day, 'Sadak', the street play competition was held which included 20 people in a team performing on relatable ideas such as stress imposed on students by the current educational system, and the power grabs in politics. The judge of the event was Mr. Suprovo Tagore. The winner of the event was Heritage Law College with the 1st Runner-up being BESC Antarjaal. The position of 2nd runners-up was shared by BESC Aarohan and Scottish Church College. Another Solo event 'Symphony' was a Monoact event of individuals from colleges and universities acting out a single script of 6 minutes. The judges for the event were Ms. Vineeta Abhani and Mrs. Ritwika Choudhury. Topics that were explored here were the loss of a child from a mother's perspective, the hypocrisy of Hindu religious rituals, and unrealistic standards in today's work field. The winner was Yuvraj Surana, a student from BESC Aarohan. The 1st runners-up were Deepti Pancharia from BESC Aarohan and Anish Poddar from B.P. Poddar College. 2nd runners-up were Upohar Jana from UEM Kolkata and Biswarup Chakraborty from Heritage Institute of Technology. There were 2 special mentions in this category namely, Sumit Kumar Das from UEM Kolkata and Mansi Jaiswal

from BESC Aarohan. The next event was Jokes Jalsa - a Comedy drama. The participating teams made use of daily life situations such as Saraswati puja and inserted the concept of comedy in a way that was appealing yet not disrespectful to others' emotions. The judges for the event were Mr. Apratim Chaterjee and Mrs. Ritwika Choudhury. The winner of the event was BESC Antarjaal and the 1st and 2nd runners-up were UEM Kolkata and Heritage Institute of Technology respectively. The Best Actor Male was Niloy Ghosh from Heritage Institute of Technology and a Best Actor Female Srishty Tiwari from Heritage Law College. After the comic relief, was, the You or Me: The Improv competition. The judge of the event was Mr. Aaron Targain. The winner of this event was Mohar Choudhary from Shri Shikshayatan College, 1st runner-up was Yuvraj Surana from BESC Aarohan, and Debashish Ghosh was the 2nd runner-up from Heritage Academy. There was also a special mention, Danny Daniel Murthy from Scottish Church College. The Improv act was followed by 'As You Like It', the Boardroom drama event which was a new addition to the Theatre Fest roster. Day 2 of the Fest concluded with parallel Boardroom drama events in different venues where the actors performed in flash mob style. The teams made clever use of the surrounding environment and they incorporated it into their act. The spectacular part was the audience's reaction and astonishment. The winner here was the UEM Kolkata. 1st runner-up was BESC Aarohan and 2nd runner-up was Shri Shikshayatan College. The last event of Day 2 was Vigya Pun, an AD spoof event that consisted of 4 teams acting as Advertisers for commodities like Remote, racket, matka, and pipe. The event was judged by Mr. Zaheed Hossain, Mr. Suprovo Tagore, and Mr. Apratim Chatterjee. The winner was the BESC Aarohan team with the Shri Shikshayatan College coming in the 1st runner-up place and UEM Kolkata as the 2nd runner-up. Day 3, began with

the Centre stage, a Stage play that marked the grandeur of this 3-day fest, with 9 participating colleges staging individual acts of 30 - 45 minutes each. Here, BESC Aarohan bagged the 1st prize. The 1st runner-up was Heritage Law College and 2nd runner-up position was shared by the Scottish Church College and B.P. Poddar College. There were some special mentions like Best Director was Deepti Pancharia from the BESC Aarohan team and the Best Script was given to Rajdeep Sarkar and Niladri Ghosh from Scottish Church College. 35. Event Name: "Gandhi Aur Sarala devi Chaudhrani: Barah Adhyay" with Novelist Alka Saravagi

Date: 04 May, 2023

The Bhawanipur Education Society College played host to a literary event - a conversation with Mrs. Alka Saravagi, an acclaimed Indian novelist and short story writer in the Hindi language. Ms.Saravagi is the proud recipient of the prestigious 2001 Sahitya Akademi Award for Hindi for her novel, Kalikatha: Via Bypass. The event, which was held in the College Library, kicked off with a warm welcome from Mr. Dilip



Shah, the Dean of Student Affairs, Mrs. Saraogi's insights into Gandhi & Sarla Devi. Ms. Saravagi's conversation was enlightening as she shared her experiences and perspectives on writing and literature. Her profound knowledge of the Hindi language and its nuances was evident as she spoke passionately about her craft. The audience was fully captivated as she shared anecdotes from her life and her writing process. She began writing in 1990, and her books were finally published in 1996. During her presentation, she deliberated on her book, 'Gandhi Aur Sarala Devi Chaudhrani: Barah Adhyay', which explores the complex relationship between M.K. Gandhi and Sarala Devi Chaudhurani during the Indian national movement. During the question-andanswer session that followed, a few students asked about the author's experiences as a woman writer, the gender-based difficulties she faced, and her suggestions for young women writers. The students also inquired about how her identity as a woman affected the characters in her novels. Another student asked about Gandhi's perspective on love and whether his authoritative approach was necessary. The author provided ideal answers to all the questions.

36. Event Name: Ray of Hope

Date: 04 May, 2023

The Bhawanipur Education Society College organized Ray of Hope, an event that brought





smiles to the faces of some underprivileged children who were accompanied by the Hum Organization. Humanity for U and Me (HUM) is a youth-based Non-Profit Organization that commenced in 2014 and focuses on providing Food, Education (Jugnu), and Employment (Kiran) to the deprived sections of the societies. Through their hard work and determination, they have reconstructed a collapsed building and are currently teaching students from Nursery to Middle School. For this event over 100 students from slums near Salt Lake and VIP Bazaar participated. HUM aims at providing a safe and nurturing environment for these children. Their dedication and commitment to making a difference in the lives of these children is truly inspiring. The attention to detail and artistic prowess exhibited by the Art in Me Collective in adorning the College Entrance and its surroundings. The team delicately made exact hand-drawn replicas of Cartoons along with quirky selfie booths for the guests. The NSS team had planned and executed a variety of engaging activities and games that catered to the interests of the children and kept them captive and engaged. A number of stalls were set up to distribute clothes, accessories, stationeries, baked items, toys, and other gift items among the children which they had to purchase using the currency tokens provided by the college allowing the children to choose items that they would enjoy. They played games like shooting balloons, aiming ping pong balls, arranging cups, consumption of hanging food without the use of their hands, etc. which was a fun and exciting experience for the students. The spellbinding and mesmerizing performances put up by the college students on popular songs like "Buddhu Sa Man Hai," "Bam Bam Bole," and "Ashiyaan" for the children were a sight to behold. 37. Event Name: Theatre Workshop

Date: 17-19 May, 2023

The Enact Collective of The Bhawanipur Education Society College organized a theater workshop for aspiring actors. The workshop was held from 17th – 19th May, 2023 in Valia Hall. The workshop was conducted by Subramya Pushak Dasgupta who has acquired graduate-level training in Hindustani classical music. He is a multi-instrumentalist, singer, theater and a film actor turned filmmaker and also an art researcher. On the first day of the workshop, breathing exercises were taught. A few vocal exercises were also taught to boast the vocal capacity of the attendants. A few interesting



games were played which helped the attendants to understand the various speeds at which a performance is usually carried out in theater. Specific situations were given, and the attendants were asked to act accordingly. The first session of the workshop ended with the practice of meditation. On the second day, the attendants of the workshop practiced breathing and vocal exercises taught the previous day. The attendants played an interesting game which signified the importance of transferring energy. They were also informed about the navrasa or the nine rasas (Emotions) innate to humans while acting. The attendants were taught about rhythms and variations in tone while delivering the dialogue. All the participants picked a dialogue and delivered it in a way that depicted a particular emotion. On the third day of the workshop, the attendants were divided into two groups of boys and girls. Their task was to present a scene with characters who looked like humans but have the spirit of an animal. The other group had to guess which character represents a particular animal. Both the teams performed well but the boy's team won the challenge.

38. Event Name: Own the Stage Date: 01 June, 2023

On 1st June the Vox Populi collective of the college organized a screening session on one thing that holds any event together, which is anchoring. The session started at 12 noon sharp at the Placement Hall filled with 50 potential anchors from different courses of the college.  Brief description of the event: The Environmental Development Committee, The Bhawanipur Education Society College organised a series of interesting events for the students to commemorate the day. The events were "Best of Waste" (Installation Art),





Short Film Making Competition and Debate Competition. Around 134 people participated in the programme out of which there were 44 faculty members, 10 non-teaching staff and 80 students. The Installation Art started off with 14 students in five groups making the best out of waste materials. The competition focused on bringing an understanding among the students about preserving the environment by reusing and recycling waste material. Various interesting ideas were demonstrated using material like newspapers, old CDs, used ropes, ice cream sticks, bangles, nut shells, pebbles, coir etc. Each group discussed in depth the importance of raw waste materials they used in making their creative endeavours to the judges. The judges, Dr. Somsankar Ray and Mr. Tathagata Sen finally selected the winners. The winners of the event were Shreyam Dey, Aiyendree Jha, and Keshvi Lakhani. The second prize was won by Adnan Abbas Ansari, Rounak Kumar, and Shashanka Souray. The third position was a tie - one group comprising of Kashish Warsiya, Nivedita, and Muskaan Gupta, and another group comprising of Tulika Dey and Alefiya Haji. One of the main attractions of the Earth Day 2023 celebrations was the filmmaking competition for the students of the college. About three weeks prior to the event,

the students were notified about the competition along with all the rules, regulations, and protocols involved. They were given a list of environment related themes and were asked to make a short film of duration not more than five minutes, and without any dialogue. - 1. Category of the Activity: Outreach Programme
- Organising unit: Department of Bengali
- Date/duration of the activity: 8 January, 2023
- Time: 06:30 am to 7:00 pm (Whole day)

- No. of Beneficiaries: 20
- Objective of the activity: To enrich students with the detailed information about World Heritage Sight - 'Potochitra Village - Naya Pingla (West-Midnapur) and Birsingha Gram (Birth Place of Iswarchandra Vidyasagar)'.
- Brief description of the activity: A one day Educational trip to Pingla Patachirtra Village and Birsingha was organized by the Department of Bengali, The Bhawanipur Education Society College. The trip was a learning and enriching experience for the students. The tour was being planned and coordinated by all the Teachers of Bengali Department and the college management. Around 20 students and teachers were part of this tour which commenced on 8th January 2023.

Pingla is basically a flourishing hub of more than 350 artists where they have formed a cluster named Chitrataru in 2011. The reason for the formation of the village focuses on the training of the next generation in this art form and also for the better opportunities of the local people with the special ability of their

innovation. Patachitra is an old form of art in Bengal. The Patuas use natural colours which they extract from leaves, flowers, seeds of various trees and they not only paint, but they also sing to describe as they unroll the painting scroll to show it to the people. These songs are specially known as Pater Gaan. The songs and paintings are basically based on the old culture, mythological tales of India and also about the current situation of our world. They form their art works as the tool for social communication and awareness. Chitrakars have painted 'patachitra' on Covid and have composed songs to spread awareness amongst the people of the remote villages. Each and every work there are examples of fine art and the beauty of simple living.

This trip was both an extension activity and an outreach project. We spent the entire day watching and observing their amazing works. The children of the village are very talented and dedicated as they have already started practicing for the future. As a mark of appreciation and encouragement of their work and effort we gave some art materials to 20 children of the village. We have bought some of their fine art pieces to help them and to support them.

We have met Anwar Chitrakar the Padmasree Award Winner and have seen his excellent works. We have also seen the other mesmerizing works of Bahadur Chitrakar, Rajesh Chitrakar, Swarna Chitrakar, Khukumoni Chitrakar, Karuna Chitrakar. Many of the Chitrakars have been since the age of 10 and have become accomplished artists winning the district awards for their skills. Many Chitrkars have participated in the events across India and also been to Australia and Indonesia. A decade back this art form was dying with only 20 artists but now Pingla is a hub of many talented artists.



We have also been to Birsingha, the birthplace of Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar. Vidyasagar Janmotsav Committee has renovated the home of Vidyasagar and has made a library. We have learnt the historical background about the place and also about the amazing works of Vidyasagar.

 Outcome of the activity: To be aware and try to save our old culture and art form by encouraging them for all the works they have been doing till date. In this project we have gathered knowledge about the culture and the historical sides of Bengal. This project has been a tremendous learning experience of the students creating an awareness for the cultural preservation and substance of the Bengal Culture and Art.

2. Category of the Activity: Outreach Programme

- Organizing Unit: Department of History, in collaboration with NSS
- Date/duration of the activity: 01 April, 2023

- Time: 11 am to 2.30 pm.
- No participants: 40 students from semesters 4 and 6 participated in the event along with 7 faculty members.
- No beneficiaries: The department distributed stationery and food packets to 50 children.
- Objective of the Activity: The extension programme was conducted with the objective of building among students a sense of responsibility and awareness to community and outreach oriented activities. The importance of conserving the Earth's precious water resource for a sustainable ecological balance was a major objective.
- Brief Description of the Activity: As part of a plantation drive, the department had provided saplings (mango and rose) that were planted in the gardens, jointly by both our students and the young children residents. A skit was presented by our students, the children presented dance performances. The skit and the children' performances were an experience of bonhomie, ties of friendship and mentorship between all of the students. These nascent ties of mentorship received fruition,





when in the convening of the drawing competition for the young minds, all students had hands-on experience in interacting with the children. The drawings were to be based on the overarching theme of bringing out the importance of water as a resource. As part of the drawing competition, we handed to the participants drawing copies and a stationary kit-complete with boxes of colors. Each of the students had interesting depictions on the necessity of water, and after detailed deliberations, competition winners were announced at the end of the event.

 Outcome of the Activity: The winners were all encouraged to explain their drawings, which they readily did. College student volunteers warmly indicated that each of the students were winners in their own right. The events of the day were thus concluded with a distribution of awards for the winners and food packet.

- Objective of the activity: To help the society "Prajapatir Pathshala" which works for the street children and addicted individuals to bring them in the mainstream of our society.
- Brief description of the activity: A noble initiative of an honest Police Man to bring street children and addicted individuals to the main stream of our society. The Police Man named Arnab Roy Chowdhury (well known as "Police Kaku") has been like a father for 40 street children. He is engaged in imparting education and other necessary facilities to these street children since the last eight years. During this period, some of his colleagues have also joined him in this endeavor. They have managed to lend a barren land from Indian Railways beside Barasat Railway Station and built an open air school. They named the school "Prajaptir Pathshala" as was coined by Kabiguru Rabindranath Tagore. As per the ideology of "Police kaku", the students (i.e., street children and addicted children) who are

analogous to caterpillars will grow and develop themselves in their unique way and will fly into the sky (alike, to the mainstream of our society) with their vibrant colours.

About the initiative taken by the Science section of B.E.S. College The department of Physics, Electronics and Statistics of The Bhawanipur Education Society College intended to organize an outreach/social activity on 28.09.2022 at Barasat (Near Railway Station) to this open air school "Prajapatir Pathshala". The Pathshala has been located beside the Barasat Railway station and has to face immense noise disturbances due to various train announcements formed throughout the day. This causes disturbances in conducting classes and various other activities for these students. As per requirements of Team Revolution (founder of "Prajapatir Pathshala"), a sound system, of significantly high decibel was donated to this Team, so that it would be capable of addressing all the students as well as to counter a portion of the noise developed during train announcements. The sound box or system is driven by a rechargeable battery since there is no availability of electrical connection in the Pathshala. After rainfall the place becomes very wet and muddy which prohibits the students from sitting on the ground which causes disruption in continuing the classes, 25 chairs were donated for the students of the Pathshala, so that they need not sit on the ground after rainfall, 50 lunch packets were distributed among the students and their family members, 4. Pen, pencil, eraser were also distributed among the students. A group of 22 students of different streams along with 16 faculty members and 6 non-teaching staff members of B.E.S. College science section visited those distressed children of the school with their full enthusiasm, support and carried out various activities. Science section of B.E.S. College is thankful to GB, IQAC, TIC, Dean of Science and VP Science for their constant support and initiative. Outcome: This outreach program helped the "Prajapatir Pathshala" with a battery driven loudspeaker, study aids, lunch packets and chairs.




PART A.3. OUTREACH PROGRAMMES OF THE DEAN'S OFFICE

Event Name: Blood Donation Carnival 2022 Date: 25 November, 2022

On 25th November 2022, a Blood Donation Carnival was organized by the NSS and NCC unit of The BESC in collaboration with Project Life Force. The carnival was flagged off at 9:00 am in the morning by the members of the College management and Project Life Force. At around 9:30 am, all the dignitaries illuminated the holy lamp and explained the importance of donating blood. 1 out of every 5 people refuses to donate blood thinking it to be fatal for them which shoves a million to the brink of death. Mr. Pranab Bedi, from team Project Life Force, not only explained the

importance of donating blood but also ensured the blood collection procedure was absolutely safe and secure. Valia Hall and classrooms were transformed into a medical unit. People in innumerable counts showered in to donate blood. There were several people for whom it was their first-time donating blood. At the end of the day, the unit collected was 755, and 2265 lives were saved with this gracious endeavour.



2. Event Name: Seminar on Emotional Wellbeing

Date: 17 May, 2023

The Bhawanipur Education Society College organised a seminar on 17th May 2023, for the "Emotional Well-being" of their students. The main aim was to cater to the youth populace of the college by providing them with the right tools and guidance which would eventually help them navigate the complexities of life and deal with feelings such as anxiety, stress, and depression. The 2-hour-long session took place in the Society Hall of the college, from 11 A.M to 1 P.M. The event began with the Dean of Student Affairs, Mr. Dilip Shah addressing the crowd as he talked about how suicide rates among youth are skyrocketing as their



emotional baggage turns heavy each day. The first speaker of the event was Sri Acaryaratna Das, the Chairman of ISKON. He informed the students about a piece of recent news regarding the suicide committed by 4 students of IIM CHENNAI. He pointed out that the main cause behind it was Depression and that 280 million people are suffering from depression worldwide. He claimed that as we reach great feats of technological marvel and remain busy, we lose touch with ourselves and a higher self that is God. He shared five tools that can help us beat depression: - knowledge, guidance, a favourable environment, a disciplined lifestyle, and meditation/prayer. He advised the students that they should not stay ignorant of their feelings and that they should never give up no matter what the situation is. The second speaker for the day was Sister Chandra from the Brahmakumari Foundation. She made the students realise their mistakes in how they view the world, by engaging them in a series of exercises. The third and final speaker at the event was Mr. Adwitio Sengupta from the Art of Living Foundation. He talked about the problems and challenges that arise in the relationships that a student has, be they platonic or romantic. He focused on the common mistakes usually made by two people in a relationship and suggested corrective measures that can be taken. He provided the audience with some "secret tips" that they can use to better their relationships.

The event saw participation from 42 Government and Government-aided Higher Educational Institutions from Kolkata District. The team consisted of 19 students participating in all the competitions of the event, namely the Youth Parliament Competition, the Youth Parliament Quiz. Youth Parliament Quiz on Character Building, the Youth Parliament Extempore Speech Competition and the Essay Competition. - Brief description of the event: A total number of 80 students accompanied by 14 teachers visited 3 museums of Kolkata—Swami Vivekananda's ancestral home, Raja Rammohan Roy's ancestral home and Rabindranath Tagore's ancestral home. In Swami Vivekananda's ancestral home, the students attended a 3D show on Swami Vivekananda's speech in the Parliament of Religion in Chicago, 1893. In Raja Rammohan Ray's home the students came to learn about the Brahmo Samaj, its establishment and ideas



- of Monotheism. The students were also explained about Ray's contribution in the Abolition of Sati Act (1929) and his pioneering role in press and individual freedom in India. In Tagore's house Jorashanko, the students learnt about the international recognition of Rabindranath Tagore as a champion of humanity and human rights.

8. Name of the Activity: Field Trip to Netaji Bhawan

- No. of Participants: 55
- Objective of the event: Political thought of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose was part of CC8 syllabus, hence the field trip was organised to enable the students to have a comprehensive understanding of the life, work and contribution of Netaji Subhash Chandra to Indian political thought.
- Brief description of the event: The Department of Political Science organised a field trip to Netaji Bhawan for the students of Semester IV. A total of 55 students accompanied by 5 teachers visited the ancestral house of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose that has been converted into a museum under the aegis of the Netaii Research Bureau since 1961.The students witnessed the iconic German-made Wanderer car that was used by Netaji in his escape from India in January 1941. They even saw Netaji's bedroom and office used as Congress President (1938-1939) with the walls painted in tricolour and the charkha at one side of his desk, preserved just the way it was left before his escape. The students were guided by the curator of the museum, Shri Anirban Bhattacharya in the Central Gallery, Europe Room, Asia Room and Sarat Bose Hall of the museum that document Netaji's life as an adolescent, as a student in Cambridge and as an ambassador of the Indian freedom movement in Europe in the 1930s. They got a glimpse into his journey in Europe between 1941-43 under the Italian pseudonym of



Orlando Mazzotta through various photographs clicked in Germany, including one with Hitler. The Asia Room documented the last lap of Netaji's role in Indian independence, as the commander of the Indian National Army in Singapore, with the Rani of Jhansi regiment of INA and the last available photograph of Netaji alighting from his plane at Saigon airport on August 17, 1945. The students were keenly interested to see exhibits of the military uniform hat he wore as the GOC of Volunteer Corps at the Congress's Calcutta conference in 1928, the silk dhoti and chadar which Netaji wore while taking his last meal, boots, cap and belt Netaji wore as the INA's Supreme Commander and the desk and chair he used in his Singapore residence.

 Outcome of the event: The field trip was a success as the students were fascinated by the life and times of Netaji and also gained an insight into the political scenario at the time of the Indian freedom movement that shaped Netaji's political ideas.

- Objective of the event: The trip was organized to educate and illustrate the students of the history honours department about the political, cultural and social history of Bengal in the eighteenth century.
- Brief description of the event: The palace of the Roys in Cossimbazar were first visited by the department faculty and students. The Roys were a prominent family in the social and cultural landscape of Murshidaad in the nineteenth century and hence the perfect first stop for the trip. After a sumptuous lunch and a guided tour of the palace, we returned to the resort after sundown. With this ended the first day of the tour. The second day of the tour (10th May, 2023) commenced with a visit to Motijheel park and the students saw for themselves a seventeenth century cannon also known as the Jahan Kosh Gun made during the reign of Shah Jahan in 1637 AD. The



students were instructed about the incredible canon-making techniques which also bore testimony to the metallurgical skill of Bengali blacksmith Janardan who made it. Soon after we departed for our next stop which was the famous Katra Masjid built for Murshid Quli Khan in 1723. The mortal remains of Murshid Quli lie beneath the steps of the mosque. Encompassing a total area of 19.5 acres, the Katra compound accommodates 700 Koran readers in the compound and 2000 people can offer namaz at the same time. After visiting the Katra mosque, we wrapped up our trip with a visit to Kathgola Bagan (the garden and Jagat Seth's house. The third day of the tour (11th May, 2023) commenced with a visit to the tomb and the mosque of Alivardi Khan and the tomb of Siraj-ud-daula, Also known as Khosbag or the "Garden of Happiness" it was built in the mid-eighteenth century. The final stop of our trip was the palace and museum of Hazarduari which was built in the mid nineteenth century.

 Outcome of the event: The outcome of the trip was most educational. A three-hour trip in the palace informed students about the priceless paintings, renowned chandelier and the architecture of the palace. The students learnt about the contribution (mostly philanthropic) and their business connections with the colonial rule in nineteenth century Bengal. - Objective of the activity: To provide students with a practical real-world perspective on different functions in organizations such as Marketing, HR, Finance, Operations, Supply Chain, and Logistics.
- · Brief description of the activity: On 24th September, 2022 an industrial visit was organized to East India Pharmaceutical Works Limited, Sarsuna, Kolkata for the students of BBA, BESC by the Director General, Dr. Suman Mukherjee. A team of 40 students were led by Prof. Jayjit Chakraborty along with seven other faculty members of the department. The students were taken to the site by college, maintaining all the Covid protocols. East India Pharmaceutical Works Limited produced its first drug as long ago as 1936. Since then its activities are aligned to the basic values of manufacturing drugs of highest quality. The Drugs and Pharmaceuticals Division of EIPW Ltd. at Sarsuna is positioned at the southern precincts of Kolkata over a wide sprawling greenery. The factory, spread over separate manufacturing blocks, is equipped with most



modern state-of-the-art equipment and machinery. This factory also hosts our entire research and development team, hence is a centre for all our innovation. One of the bulk drug units of EIPW Ltd. is located in a serene environment at the southern outskirts of Kolkata. The main synthetic Drugs plant is situated at Durgapur, (170 Kms from Kolkata) amidst a picturesque eco-friendly surrounding. The Mission of East India Company is to provide thoroughly researched, superior quality and cost effective "medicines for millions". To achieve customer and employee satisfaction and manage their operations with high concerns for safety and environment. Their Vision to increase their global presence, continuously develop advanced formulations through precise R&D, along with making medication more and more affordable to people and also exploring newage, futuristic opportunities in the healthcare industry.Mr. Debarshi Duttagupta, The Managing Director of the Company welcomed and directed us through the entire visit. The expert team of the industry consists of Mr. Anjan Mukherjee, the Head Caption of the industry; Dr. Goyal, the Head of Quality Control; Mr. Abhijeet Mitra, the Head of Maintenance: Mr. Sandip Biswas, the Head of Labour Welfare Officer; Mr. Jayanta Basu, the Head of Marketing Head. The company is leading from 60-70 years and managing the 3rd generation is guite challenging. They are most regulated by Schedule M & T of the Drugs & Cosmetic Act. They have FDA certification with gold standards. They have a big cultural wing; blood donation camps are held and Vishwakarma puja is celebrated with full enthusiasm. They believe in employee satisfaction being the key factor. The branch of Sarsuna have around 300 - 325 employees. Not even a single strike is held in the company, the MD personally sits with the union four times a year to keep up the concerns. The greenery of the environment is taken care of along with three ponds, one of them has a turtle which is 70 years old. The company keeps up with upgradation as per 2 years ahead of time, earlier they used machines that were handled manually but now they have upgraded to Al driven machines which requires minimum one person to handle. The board sees to it that- A. The company grows according to the plan; B. Everyone in the company is happy and growing. The operations include 50% of the manufacturing of the pharmaceutical plant and 50% of the sales, 800 salesperson work under Mr. Jayanta Basu for the Sales of the formulation unit. They believe that their biggest investment is in people. Though The company lacks a proper HR department. Their best-selling products are- Pyrigesic 650, Pyrigesic 1000, Pyrigesic MR, Locula (10%, 20%, 30%), Tisol-200, URJ (ayurvedic product), Vitazyme. They have come up with herbal body oils-Sandalite body oil. They are in the process of launching mosquito repellent with eucalyptus oils. Pyrigesic 1000, is the no. 1 paracetamol brand in India and is only produced in the Sarsuna factory. The Doll House consists of the miniature versions of the machines like CO-01 (machine for coating tablets), HU-03 (stability chambers), T-01 (tablet machines), L-02 (fridge dryer), C-01

(centrifuge research), DT-01 (for creating the disintegrate). The Lab where HP analysis of the samples as per the standard set, Chromatology, Spectrophotometer, Infrared-spectroscope, leak test, pH meter, filter is done. Dr. P Mallik looks after the Medical Clinic of the company. The Management & Information Systems, the IT department with self-developed ERP and Oracle.

The dry labs are used for storing instruments and wet labs are used for doing the research. The new labs- QC (microbiology), led by Dr. Bhattacharya- head of the RM. They have the quality control system, air handling units to filter the air, GLP certification, ABCD classification of chambers. They check the pathogens and bacteria of the drugs, and also have a sterilization room. The lab has 4 chemists & 3 assistants. The finished products are kept as samples till expiry for each and every batch of medicines produced. QR code is used in packaging to escape the spurious products. Small changes are made in the packaging of the product continuously to avoid spurious products. Modular form is used for energy conservation. The DM water plant has water conductivity less than 2 microns, this is the anti-mineralised water used in injections. The Quality Assurance Department ensures that each product passes through the rinsing machine to the filling & sealing area to labelling & packaging area and finally to the collating & case packing. After the packaging, random product is taken for sampling before it is launched in the market, to assure the quality. The Oral Solid Dosage Formulations Department, the only department for oral solid dosage in East Bengal. This department has the purest form of air (3.5micron) and is ensured that there is zero contamination, GI panels are used for the construction of this department, Epoxy floor to avoid dust. White tablets are produced here. The Raw Material



Day Store, stores the approved material, the primary & secondary packaging material, uniflow system for transporting the medicines from one room to other is used, hepa filter is used for air wash. The raw materials passes through granules guarantine; to compression (where man entry & material entry is from different gates) for differential air pressure (single rotary & double rotary); from there it is passed to quality control (inspection room); to IPQC room (in process quality control), then we get the finished product. All the departments of the industry consume electricity of around Rs. 17-18 lakhs per month. The supply of the medicines is all over India and that is done in the brand name itself. The generic supply is made to all the government-based supplies. The visit of the industry was tried to be done within 3 – 4 hours covering all the aspects of productions, marketing, operations and logistics. The industrial visit was beneficial for the students as it brought clarity to important management concepts, as students practical experience first-hand how these concepts are put into action. It bridges the gap between classroom theoretical training and practical learning in a real-life environment. It brings out an opportunity to identify the student's prospective area of work. It enhances their interpersonal skill and get to see the best practices opted by companies for similar work.

 Outcome of the activity: Students were able to ascertain: How the company retain its employees? How is the organizational structure such that the salary distributed among the employees is done without angst? How does the board function and manage? How the proper cleaning and hygiene of the factory is managed? How is the product mix done? How the account of medicines is kept? How is the Al compiled with labour?

Then the products go through the die-casting. testing process and then to the assembly for packaging and being dispatched through automatic as well as by manually. Containers are dispatched to Khidderpore Dock/ Haldia. The Mission of Patton is to provide environmental friendly manufacturing safe and sustainable precision products, reducing carbon footprint by embracing green engineering. They Vision to expand their global footprint and become the global market leaders and to make the difference in their industry and society. The foundry showcased machinery for casting various types of iron components used in different sectors (railways, construction, and machinery). Students also witnessed the entire process of melting iron in the cupola and its moulding into different moulds. In detailed discussions with the

 - Brief description of the event: The Bhawanipur Education Society College, Dept. of Commerce (Morning) organized an Excursion to Sikkim and North Bengal Tour from April 16, 2023 to April 23, 2023, with 45 students, accompanied by 3 faculties, Mr Vivek Patwari, Mr Chandan Jha & Ms Trupti Upadhyay. It was a thoughtfully curated expedition to Sikkim and North Bengal, which transpired over a span of 5N/6D. Central to the trip's allure was a perfect amalgamation of adventure activities, industrial visits, team-building games, and management games, all seamlessly intertwined to create a comprehensive experience. - Brief description of the event: The industrial tour committee of the Department of Commerce (Afternoon and Evening Section) organised an industrial tour from the 6th to 11th June 2023. 42 students of different



semesters were accompanied by seven teachers and mentors for the visit. The Tour gave an opportunity to all to gain an insight into the production, packaging, branding, marketing procedures, waste management and labour benefits offered by Happy Valley Tea Estate and Matelli Tea Estate. They also gained knowledge on the varying climatic conditions and manufacturing processes associated with manufacturing of both Darjeeling Tea and CTC tea. This Tour also gave an opportunity to the students to develop leadership qualities and interpersonal skills apart from giving them an in-depth understanding of the operation of two major types of Tea manufacturing organizations.

- Name of the Activity: Industrial Visit to DVC, Chandrapura
- Category of the Activity: Extension Activity
- Organising unit: Department of Chemistry





- Duration of the activity: 21-22 October, 2022
- · Time: Whole Day
- · No. of Participants: 27
- Objective of the activity:.
- · Brief description of the activity: An industrial visit was organized by the Department of Chemistry on 21.10.2022 and 22.10.2022 at the Chandrapura Thermal Power Station (presently it has two units with a total installed capacity of 500 MW (2×250 MW) located at Chandrapura, Bokaro. Twenty-Three (23) students of semester III and V of the Department of Chemistry of The Bhawanipur Education Society College, Kolkata accompanying with Dr. Pinki Saha Sardar, Dr. Saugata Konar, Dr. Yeasin Sikder, Mr. Sourav Das and Mr. Atanu Maity (Laboratory assistant) went to this Industrial Visit. This visit started with students congregating in the Howrah Station at around 11 pm on 20th of October. 2022. The train departed at around 12:05 am from Howrah Station and reached Chandrapura at around 8 a.m. in the next morning. The students along with the teachers had a tiring but a memorable train journey. Hotel check-ins at Hotel Reliance, Bokaro were done smoothly.

On that day (21.10.2022), after reaching the hotel, students and teachers went to the Damodar Valley Corporation (DVC) by road at around 12:30 pm after having delicious food. The students were enlightened on various topics in the DVC. They had acquired practical knowledge about the removing of undesirable chemicals, biological contaminants, suspended solids, and gases from water for water management (one of the bifurcating parts of DVC along with thermal power) both for the purpose of boiler and supply of drinking water to nearby villages using various techniques. They also learnt about the controlling of water hardness and pH using ion exchange resin and different chemicals. After that we visited the coal examination room with proper safety where they experienced the use of different sophisticated instruments including the Atomic Absorption Spectroscopy (AAS), coal grinder, hot air oven with higher temperature variant, bomb calorimeter etc. They have learnt how to determine the calorific value of coal sample before it is taken to the furnace for thermal power generation. The students also experienced the transportation process of coal from train to the boiler with proper safety. Both the students and teachers were very much excited after seeing all the projects.

Everyone departed from there in the evening and returned back to the hotel by bus. This was followed by a lot of fun and multiple jamming sessions amongst the students till dinner. The next day (22.10.2022) was reserved for sight-seeing in and near Bokaro. At 8 pm in the evening, the train left from Chandrapura and reached Howrah at around 4 a.m. in the next morning. Everyone learnt a lot from this trip and made a lot of memories which they will cherish forever.

The students were also motivated about the industries and practical approach they

received from DVC. This Industrial visit was a complete blend of education and amusement. The main focus of this industrial visit was to acquire practical knowledge and for implementation of these in future.

 Outcome of the activity: We have gained the idea of practical knowledge about the removal of undesirable chemicals, biological contaminants, suspended solids, and gases from water for water management both for the purpose of boiler and supply of drinking water to nearby villages using various techniques. Also, the use of different sophisticated instruments including the Atomic Absorption Spectroscopy (AAS), Coal Grinder, Hot Air oven with higher temperature variant, bomb calorimeter etc are utilized in DVC.

- Objective of the Activity: On the 18th of November 2022, the Department of Computer Science of The Bhawanipur Education Society College embarked on an educational trip to the city of Hyderabad. The purpose of this trip was to educate the students about the intricacies of film-making, and to emphasize the role of computers in the various aspects of creating a movie.
- Brief Description of the Activity:

Day-1: The teachers and students of the department of computer science of the Bhawanipur Education Society College, started the 3-day trip with a visit to the



Salarjung museum. The team got to view the world famous English Bracket Clock in action, along with an array of beautiful marble statues which were made during the British rule. The team then proceeded to the Golconda Fort. Golconda fort is undoubtedly one of the most magnificent fortress complexes in India. The Department of Electronics of The Bhawanipur Education Society College organised an Industrial Visit to Bose Institution, Darjeeling on 24th March 2023. The objective behind such a visit was to match theoretical knowledge of the students with the real working environment.

After reaching the place the event started around 11 AM. The incharge supervisor of the hydel project gave a detailed tour of the Teesta Canal Fall Hydel Project, which is erected in the Teesta Canal of West Bengal in India. The total installed capacity of the power plant is 67.5 MW. The total number of turbines in the power house is nine and capacity per turbine is 7.5 MW. The unit size of the plant is 67.5 MW having nine units of 7.5 MW each. There are nine units in the plant and all are commissioned. This power project is owned by the West Bengal State Government and the operator of the plant is West Bengal State Electricity Distribution Company Limited (WBSEDCL).

Students of the department got exposed to the real application of industry machinery. They got the knowledge and picture of working departments in the real configuration which is difficult to imagine in theory classes. Students understood the connection between semiconductor devices and circuits, power electronics, different types of instruments, total control systems of the aforementioned project and its working procedure.

The event concluded around 3 PM. The department of Electronics is very much hopeful that this visit will bring a dimension to students' education, which they cannot gain in the classroom as well as will help them to make connections between the different aspects of their educational experience.

- b. Computer Awareness Program: The Department of Electronics of science section conducted a Computer Awareness Program on 21/03/2023 at Bich Kagay Jr High School, Kagay Bazar, Kalimpong where the students of the department demonstrated a hands-on program on basic computer applications among the students of the rural school. The event started with a total of 12 students and seven teachers of Bich Kagay Junior School along with thirteen members of our college. Before the computer awareness programme got started the senior teacher of Bich Kagay Junior School gave a short speech of introduction. From there we got to know that this Junior School is runned by few volunteer teachers and other non teaching staff. They also provide a mid-day meal to the student.
- c. Educational Tour to Bose Institution: The Department of Electronics of The Bhawanipur Education Society College organised an Educational Visit to Bose Institution, Darjeeling on 22th March 2023. The objective behind such a visit was so that the students can get exposed to such an environment that

- holds importance not only to the field of scientific research but also how the place in itself is a shared witness to the existence of such a great man who carved the path of science for the whole of India. Upon reaching there students and faculty members were welcomed with astonishing hospitality by the head and staff of the institution. For the first part of the event they were invited to Bose Museum where the museum supervisor gave a detailed tour of the Museum while narrating the beautiful history of the place, its origin, Dr Bose's working habits etc. All of which proved to be very inspirational to the students and the teachers present there.
- d. Report on an Outreach Activity: "What do we live for if not to make the world less difficult for each other" - George Eliot An Outreach Activity was oraganised by the Department of Electronics of The Bhawanipur Education Society College on 21st March, 2023 at Bich Kagay Jr. High School, Kagay Bazar, Kalimpong where they donated as well as installed a Computer setup. They also distributed educational stationery items among the students of that rural school. Around ten students and three teachers participated in that outreach activity. The whole program was planned and conducted by the department (both, teachers and students) with active support from the college management. Bich Kagay Jr. High School is a rural school which is located near Kagay Bazar at Kalimpong. Recently, the school has been extended up to class VIII. The school comprises twenty students and five volunteer teachers. The students obtained theoretical knowledge of basic computer courses but they had no computer for practicals. So, the students of the school faced difficulties in understanding the subject. The teachers and students of the department reached the School around 11:30 AM in the morning on 21 st March, 2023. They



were warmly welcomed by the teachers and students of the School. Then the students of the department of Electronics assembled and installed the computer which was donated to that school.

Outcome of the activity: An outreach program

- Objective of the activity: To acquaint the students with the real world and take them beyond the limits imposed by a pre-set syllabus.
- Brief description of the activity: The tour started from Howrah station on the afternoon of 01 June 2023. After a night halt at Siliguri,





the group of 29 students and 5 teachers reached Darjeeling on 2 June 2023. The first halt in Darjeeling was at Bose Institute, Darjeeling. The premises were built by the founder, Acharya J.C. Bose in 1920 and houses a museum and a research centre. A detailed tour of Acharya Bose's house that has been converted into a museum was given by Mrs Yashodhara Yadav, Junior Laboratory Assistant. The students were also explained some of the seminal experiments conducted by Bose. Mrs Yadhav also explained the recent experiment being conducted by the institute on the level of air pollution in and around Darjeeling. On June 3, 2023, the group visited Tiger Hills at dawn to view Mt Kanchenjunga and Mt Everest. Later in the day the group visited the Makaibari Tea Estate at Kurseong. The students were explained the different stages of tea processing - from the gardens in the foothills of the Himalaya to the auction house in Kolkata. On the final day the group moved back to Siliguri via Simanta on the Indo-Nepal border and Mirik Lake. On 5 June the group reached Howrah in the afternoon.

 Outcome of the activity: An excursion initiates students, particularly those who are not used to hostel life, to the joys and vagaries of community living. The department had provided each student with exercise books and stationery to pen down their thoughts regarding the tour. It is evident from these tour diaries that though enjoyment with friends was an agenda, they were not oblivious to their surroundings. While they could appreciate the scenic beauties, they could also identify the infrastructural bottlenecks that could hamper the tourism industry in and around Darjeeling in the near future. Concern about the excessive traffic jam, pollution, changing weather conditions, unplanned constructions, etc. that are affecting both tourism and the tea industry in Darjeeling finds mention in their observations. Thus one can see that the application of coursework to real life experience was an important and welcome outcome of the trip.



Anaemia was another most noted problem among these students and proper dietary advice was given in severe cases iron supplementation was also advised.

- Brief description of the activity: On 1.4.2023, the Department of History, in collaboration with NSS circle of the Bhawanipur Education Society College, organised an Extension and Outreach Programme, at Shanti Rani Primary School at Bansdroni. The programme was organised to celebrate World Water Day (held each year on 22nd March). The faculty and the students had all assembled together in the college premises, boarded the bus and reached the center at around 11 am. The







premises contained lush gardens and opportunities for its residents to ensure all round holistic development.  Outcome of the activity: More than 22 student volunteers and around 100 attendees actively participated in the drive, indicating their recognition of the importance of such initiatives for a greener and healthier environment.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Infrastructure plays an important role in the education sector. Classroom design, auditoriums, laboratories, campus area etc. are crucial elements of a learning environment. The high-quality infrastructure facilitates better instruction, improves student outcomes, and reduces dropout rates, among other benefits. The institution offers undergraduate Honours programmes in Arts, Commerce, Management and Science, as well as postgraduate courses in English and Commerce. It also runs several career-oriented courses like Commerce+. Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), Certified Financial Planner (CFP), Corporate Communications, Capital Market, Cyber Security and Global Management Skills, which takes students beyond the rigid framework of a syllabus and provides holistic development for students. In order to ensure the smooth

running of all these programmes and courses the institution has a structured policy for augmentation, replacement and maintenance of infrastructure by a dedicated team of maintenance staff. The policy ensures that the academic infrastructure of the College vis a visits current requirements are assessed regularly and steps are taken to correct any deficiencies or imbalances, proper maintenance and upgradation of all laboratories is conducted regularly, new books, journals and periodicals are added to the library every year according to the needs of the students and the teachers. Resources which are available from Government bodies like UGC, DST to improve the laboratories, are garnered and improvements are undertaken to benefit the students. At present the campus area is 16894 sq m with 72 WiFi/LAN enabled smart classrooms, 32 well equipped laboratories, 7 Computer Labs and 7 ICT-enabled Seminar Halls.

KNOWLEDGE RESOURCE CENTRE (COLLEGE LIBRARY)

Vision Statement:

The Knowledge Resource Centre aims at providing students with the apparatus and environment required for effective study and learning. Through the combination of a supportive environment managed by competent professionals and the best available technology required for utilising digital resources, the Knowledge Resource Centre caters to the multifaceted needs of students, faculty members and the management alike. It harbours the infrastructure for the facilitation of academic excellence.

Library Resource Details:

As of June 2023, there are 59773 books in the Main Library, 411 books in the Departmental Library (Seminar Library), 27 journals / magazines, 14 newspapers, 18003 e-journals. 307581 ebooks, subscriptions and remote access to e-resources such as Capitaline Database, JSTOR, Personal E Library 2.0, Inflibnet Nlist. We have access to books, magazines, DVDs, newspapers, audiobooks, e-books by virtue of the Institutional membership of the British Council Library.



Student Footfall Statistics:

The total number of working days from April 2023 to June 2023 were 67. The number of students who visited the library in this period was 19984. The highest number of students' footfall in this period was in the month of May 2023 (8016). In this period, 13993 books were issued, 12346 books were returned, and 4451 books were reissued. The total number of teachers' and staff's footfall in this period was 553. 252 books were issued by the teachers and staff members in this period, 242 books were returned, and 26 books were re-issued.

Library Services and Facilities:

The Knowledge Resource Centre remains open for six days a week from Monday to Saturday from 8.00 am to 8.00 pm. It provides paperless issue, return and re-issue of books, journals and magazines. It is equipped with ten Wi-fi enabled computers for the use of the students where they can access e-resources and other relevant data. OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) facility is also made available to the students. The students also have access to JSTOR. Pearson eBooks and Capitaline Database. The Institutional Repository section on the library website is made available to teachers and students where they can access the syllabus and previous years' question papers. A separate computer and separate tables are allocated for the use of the teachers.

Strength:

Challenges:

- Expansion within the campus is one of the major challenges that the college must deal with a sense of urgency.
- Lack of financial support (State & Central Government) for running research projects by the UG/PG students.
- To search for innovation or excellence in course curriculum to project amongst the students providing short topics to pursue the novelty by any one method viz. making a video lecture, making a model experiment, making a poster, preparation of a short review paper.
- Central and State Government funding are not coming proactively for better curriculum/

- infrastructure development and introducing more skill-based programmes.
- Lack of space inside the campus for outdoor games has often created reluctance among students for attending the college. The games and sports not only hone the physical talents and skills of the students but also make them disciplined and focused.
- The existing placement cell need to be more resourceful and need to extend networks in various professional sectors creating more and more job opportunities for the students.
- Plants and folliages are limited due to lack of open space, hence the carbon footprint is high. More energy-efficient installations are needed to reduce the carbon footprint, being an urban college.
- Completing the syllabus satisfactorily within a limited period under the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) is a major challenge for the faculty.
