2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The Bhawanipur Education Society College aims for holistic development of the students. In order to enhance the learning outcomes, all the department of the college. It evaluates the learning needs of the students. Remedial classes were also conducted for students to aid the low achievers and identify their learning difficulties which will ultimately help them climb the ladder of success.

Advanced learners are identified primarily based on their past performance. They are

encouraged to become lifelong learners by providing them with adequate institutional

support like

- Remedial classes
- Tutorial classes
- A well-stocked library
- E-resources
- Skill enhancement courses
- Workshops & student seminars
- Library mentoring sessions

Learning is made more student-centric through a combination of new methods of

teaching. In addition to chalk and talk strategy, students are encouraged to make PowerPoint presentations on specific topics to encourage independent thinking and involvement in the classroom. Remedial classes, Tutorial classes and Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) is conducted at regular intervals. Further these students are taken for industry visits, sent for internships, and are involved in community welfare projects. Mentoring, workshops, student seminars and publications, wall magazines, and projects are other methods to make learning more student-centric specially for slow learners. The introduction of smart classes and Cloud Campus are steps in the same direction.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

In our institution we encourage learning by doing. The experiential learning strategies include lab work, field work conducted by departments of -Economics, Physics, Chemistry along with industry visit in some cases and projects are completed by department of Commerce, BBA, Computer Science, Electronics. Participatory learning is encouraged through student seminars, group discussions, debates, brain storming sessions, story reading sessions, quiz competition. Students are taught to first identify the problem and collect necessary data and think to generate alternative solutions to the problem and then select the best one to implement and review the same, which enhances their problemsolving skills.

The college endeavors to give its students state-of-the-art infrastructure for an enhanced teaching-learning experience. The teachers in our college have been trained, in both offline and online mode, to access, acclimatize, and use these new ICT tools for effective curriculum delivery and meaningful engagement with students. In order to make the process student-centric and congenial, teachers attend a number of workshops to increase their proficiency. Post-pandemic teachers continue to efficiently use technological support such as Google Classrooms, Microsoft Whiteboard and Google Jam board (web application), Google Earth (geography-based application), Microsoft PowerPoint, YouTube videos, and Canva to make the teaching-learning process effective for young learners. Online assessments and sharing of extra reading/study materials and resources are uploaded on departmental Google classrooms from time to time. It has been noted that using ICT in the classroom has improved the students' subject interest. Students show more curiosity and awareness when ICT teaching is involved rather than the usual chalk-and-talk method. BESC classrooms have whiteboards and projectors installed for an innovative teaching-learning environment. Teachers in the college constantly use ICT to enable creative educational resources and the renewal of learning and communicating processes. It assists in establishing a more active collaboration of students and the simultaneous acquisition of technological knowledge.

Bhawanipur Education Society College conducts Continuous Internal Examinations(CIE) every semester. A subsequent Internal Assessment (IA) follows thisexamination. A major purpose of CIEs is to assist students with their regularclassroom learning, student participation, attention, and growth. As for InternalAssessments, these are conducted following University of Calcutta guidelines. Foreach core course, the college conducts Internal Assessments before students taketheir university's end-of-semester theory examination. Based on the IA marks, the CGPA for the student is calculated by the university. Departments plan InternalAssessment examinations precisely and with clarity. Consequently, different assignments are assigned for each of the papers to meet the learning objectives. 2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The Bhawanipur Education Society College follows the guidelines set by the University of Calcutta regarding Internal Assessments, Tutorials, and End Semester Theory Examinations. Formal notices are uploaded to the college website, notice boards, and WhatsApp groups so that exam dates are well communicated and no students miss out on examinations. In case of any grievances, the student directly approaches the concerned teacher/mentor who addresses the grievances as she/he may deem fit. If a student is unable to appear for an internal examination due to medical or any other genuine reason, upon submission of proper documents, the internal assessment is rescheduled based on the joint decision of the Department, Vice -Principal, and Teacher-in-Charge. There are several checks and balances for ensuring that the process of continuous assessment is rigorously adhered to in every class. However, students are given a fair chance to lodge their grievances and question the system through their mentoring classes if they have logical reasons for the same. Additional tutorial coaching through Bridge/ Remedial/Tutorial classes is provided by departmental teachers to students who have difficulties in certain areas of their syllabus. There is also a system of PPR/RTI available under Calcutta University (C.U.) of which we are an affiliate College. Students can apply for a rechecking of their evaluated papers within one month of the declaration of results. The college provides all official support in this process.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Physical Facilities:

The college possesses ample infrastructure and physical resources essential for the efficient functioning of its various programs and courses. With well-equipped classrooms, laboratories, computer labs, staff rooms, conference halls, seminar halls, and an extensive library, the college spans an area of 18,343.13 square meters. The college is spread across six different addresses, each contributing to its expansive campus area. An organized policy for the enhancement and upkeep of infrastructure is implemented by a dedicated maintenance team.

Classrooms with ICT:

The college proudly houses 81ICT-enabled classrooms

Laboratories:

The college has a total of 26 laboratories for both undergraduate (Hons. and Gen) students and a dedicated research lab. Among these, 7 computer labs with 258 computers, equipped with necessary configurations and high-speed internet connectivity, contribute to a conducive learning environment. Utilizing resources from government bodies like UGC and DST, the college continuously

strives to enhance its laboratories for the benefit of students and academic endeavours.

Seminar Halls:

Additionally, there are 7 seminar halls, 4 of which are equipped with ICT facilities

Tutorial Rooms:

The class-rooms are also used to provide Mentoring and Tutorial sessions for the students, during free-periods.

Library Facility:

The well-stocked college library boasts 57,266 books, 25 journals/magazines, 14 newspapers, 307,581 e-books, and around 17,922 e-journals, updated annually. Students enjoy remote access to extensive e-resources, and the library reading room is accessible to students from morning, day, and evening sections, operating from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM, Monday to Saturday.

The Indoor Games-cum-Common Room, commonly known as the Sports Arena, serves as a dedicated space for recreational activities. The girls' Sports Arena spans 1508.13 square feet, while the boys' counterpart measures 1499.485 square feet. Within these arenas, various gaming facilities are available such as:

- 2 Table Tennis tables (1 with a Robot Machine for advanced players),
- 1 Billiards board, 1 Snooker board,
- multiple Carrom and Chess boards,
- 2 Darts boards, and
- 3 Rifle shooting setups.
- Furthermore, the central quadrangle features an Artificial

Turf measuring 3239.85 square feet, functioning as a versatile sports ground for activities such as Basketball, Badminton, and Volleyball. It also hosts intra-college and inter-departmental tournaments for Football and Cricket, along with other game-related events.

• The college has established a collaboration with Balok Sangha, 22 Pally, allowing students to utilize the Northern Park for training and practice purposes.

In addition to sports and games, the college places significant emphasis on cultural activities as an integral part of students' holistic development. Various cultural events are organized by collectives and individual departments in venues like the Auditorium (Society Hall - 1163.16 sq. ft.), Concept Hall (3644 sq. ft.), and Jubilee Hall (4438.36 sq. ft.). The Society Hall accommodates around 100 students, while the Concept Hall and Jubilee Hall can each host 250 students simultaneously, providing dynamic spaces for cultural enrichment

This system plays a pivotal role in facilitating the library staff, faculty, and students by providing accurate information and data about the available resources.

The Green CAMPUS software contributes to enhancing the quality of library resources through the generation of various reports. These reports are routinely analyzed to gain insights into usage patterns, subsequently informing improvements to the library's facilities.

Notable features of Green CAMPUS include

- The management of entry and exit records for both students and faculty,
- Barcode-enabled processes for issue and return,
- Online public access catalogue (opac),
- Barcode and call number assignment for all books and documents,
- RFID and QR code-based entry, issue, return, reissue, and exit procedures for students.

The software also offers reminder return message alert services

and generates diverse usage reports, such as

- Management Information System (MIS) reports,
- Reminder message reports,
- User reports,
- Issue, return, and reissue reports.

Additionally, it provides reports on the number of hours spent in the library for study purposes, enabling the library to recognize and reward the Best Library User, thereby incentivizing more effective library usage. Furthermore, it maintains a patron issue and return history for documentation purposes. This comprehensive system contributes significantly to the efficient and organized functioning of the Knowledge Resource Centre.

4.3 - IT Infrastructure

The college offers well-equipped computer laboratories to support both students and faculty. With a total of 258 computers dedicated to academic use, the facilities also include desktops, laptops, USB drives, scanners, and printers for both academic and administrative needs. The campus is equipped with Wi-Fi, and there are 81 smart classrooms with overhead projectors to facilitate ICTintegrated learning.

A gigabit LAN connection, both wired and wireless, ensures highspeed data transfer across the campus. To maintain cybersecurity, antivirus software is regularly updated and installed on all terminals to safeguard against viruses and unauthorized access, ensuring smooth traffic flow.

The college boasts a cumulative bandwidth of 54 MBPS, supported by leased line internet connections from TATA (20 MBPS), JIO (20 MBPS), and AIRTEL (14 MBPS).

Furthermore, the college offers faculty and students access to a cutting-edge digital workspace. A Virtual Learning Environment complements the physical learning spaces, accessible through

4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

The college boasts a proficient in-house team, led by an executive engineer, dedicated to the upkeep and repair of its infrastructure. This team ensures a clean and inviting atmosphere throughout the college. Their efforts encompass various maintenance and utilization strategies:

- Classrooms and laboratories undergo daily cleaning, while washrooms and common areas receive frequent cleaning by a specialized team. A dedicated manager oversees the maintenance, upgrades, and daily care of the laboratories.
- Equipment such as water purifiers, air conditioners, lifts, and the sports complex are covered under Annual Maintenance Contracts (AMCs).
- Laptops, desktops, licensed software, CCTVs, and AC units are also maintained through AMCs.

INSTITUTIONAL VALUES AND BEST PRACTICES

7.1 - Institutional Values and Social Responsibilities

7.1.1 - Measures initiated by the Institution for the promotion of gender equity during the year

In the endeavour to foster a culture of respect, inclusivity and equality, the college undertakes various initiatives for its female students and staff members. A complaint box is placed near the principal's office for suggestions or complaints from female staff and students. Grievance Redressal Committee, Anti-ragging Committee, Sexual Harassment Committee and Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) are in place to ensure safety and security. Security personnel and CCTV monitoring are available around the clock. There is a female doctor available especially for female students. A camp for health and haemoglobin check-ups is held annually. To increase security, walls enclose the entire site.

Awareness programs, lectures, and special talks are frequently held in collaboration with the IQAC, not only to promote gender neutrality but also to create safe spaces for open dialogue on equality and sensitivity.

Additionally, measures for the professional development of female staff include specialised training in mentoring and counselling skills. Female students are also encouraged to participate in various sports activities held in the college from time to time.

Apart from mentors helping mentees work through emotional and academic problems, the college has a partnership with UMMEED, a psychological counselling agency that offers students counselling while guaranteeing total confidentiality. Pre-marital counselling, women empowerment and self-defence workshops are organised by the college's own career guidance and counselling committee. The institution uses updated techniques in the disposal of waste.

Solid Waste: The college disposes of all wastes, whether solid or otherwise, in a scientific manner and ensures that it is not released directly to the environment. Recycled paper is used for in-house purposes.

Liquid Waste: Practical labs like Chemistry and Environmental Science have taken measures to ensure that all the chemicals are diluted before discarding in the wash basin.

Glassware used in the laboratory is washed and rinsed with the least quantity of water and placed in the liquid waste container.

E-waste Management: Awareness programmes are initiated on e-waste management. The cartridge of the laser printer is refilled outside the college campus UPS batteries are recharged/repaired/ exchanged by the suppliers.

The Physics laboratory generates solid e-waste containing diodes, chips, transistors, dry cells etc. which are segregated, collected in separate bags and labelled.

Hazardous Waste Management: The college ensures that the campus environment is free of pollution.

In the Chemistry Lab: a) Chemicals used in the lab for the reaction are not discharged into the environment, but rather stored in sealed containers.

b) Repeated distillation of used solvent may be done to reduce solvent waste, thereby minimising pollution.
