### **IQAC activities during the academic year July 2023- June 2024**

#### **A. Bringing to a close the 2nd NAAC Assessment Cycle**

The functions of the IQAC entail preparation and submission of the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) as per the guidelines and parameters of NAAC. This function culminates into an institutional visit by a NAAC peer team so as to facilitate second, third and subsequent cycles of accreditation. During the institutional visit, the NAAC peer team interacts with the IQAC to know about its functioning, progress, and the quality sustenance initiatives undertaken by it, before submitting their recommendations to NAAC. On January 4 and 5, 2024, the NAAC Peer Team visited BES College for the second cycle of accreditation. The team included Dr HPS Chauhan, Chairperson and Former Professor, Devi Ahilya University; Dr. Debal Dasgupta, Member Coordinator and Former Professor, The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda; and Dr. Snehal Donde, Member and Former Dean, Bhaktivedanta Research Centre.

During the visit, the various departments, offices, committees, student collectives and the IQAC, under the chairmanship of the Teacher-in-Charge of the college, put forth the various aspects of quality centric, student centric, technology driven initiatives and processes that the college has been practicing. The Peer Team inspected each and every activity of the college and also interacted with different college stakeholders, including current students, alumni, parents, teaching and non-teaching staff. The management's vision, leadership, and governance were also reviewed through meetings with the college's administrative

bodies. The culmination of the visit led to a 'A' grade reaccreditation of the BES College.

##### DEPARTMENT - BENGALI

#### 1. Name of the Activity: Sufibad O Banglar Sanskriti

- Type of Activity: Seminar
- Date/ Duration of Activity (from-to): 30th September, 2023
- Time: 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm
- Details of Resource persons: Prof. Amit Dey, Prof. Ashutosh Mukherjee, Dr. Ipshita Halder and Prof. Arun Bandyopadhyay
- No. of Participants: 167
- Objective of the event: The Department of Bengali collaborated with Pashchimbanga Itihas Samsad to host a seminar/panel discussion on Sufism and Bengali culture, duly ratified by the IQAC of our college in Jubilee Hall on Saturday, 30th September, 2023. The panel included very distinguished speakers, Prof. Amit Dey, Prof. Ashutosh Mukherjee, Professor, of the Department of History, University of Calcutta and Dr. Ipshita Halder, Associate Professor of Comparative Literature, Jadavpur University, Kolkata. The session was chaired by the eminent historian, Prof. Arun Bandyopadhyay.
- Brief description of the event: Dr. Dey gave the historical perspective of how Sufism was imbibed in various ways for centuries in India, while Dr. Halder spoke about the influence of the philosophy in Bengali literature and music.

They illustrated how in the 19th century, many great minds of Bengal like Raja Rammohan Roy and Maharshi Debendranath Tagore took active interest in Persian poetry, particularly, in the works of Hafiz and Jalaluddin Rumi. Prof. Amit Dey enumerated the multifarious ways in which Bengali culture and society were transformed under the influence of Sufism. Emphasizing on certain key concepts of Sufism, like love, annihilation, he sought to explain how Sufism was widely accepted by the people of Bengal. He cited the structural similarity between the domes of temples and mosques and the shape of the caps that Sufi devotees wore. Illustrating the importance of religious travel, place-making and space-making, Prof. Dey highlighted the amalgamation of the universal and the local in Sufi thoughts and practices. For instance, he showed how by integrating the universal tenets of Sufi religious beliefs and couching them in local terms and





understanding, the Sufis were better able to communicate their ideas among the people. He also sought to explain why Bengal did not produce any charismatic Sufi which ultimately became synonymous with a site, as in the case of Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti or Khwaja Nizamuddin Auliya. It is here that he introduced the idea of warrior Sufis of Bengal, who prioritized the task of spreading the ideas of Sufism in Bengal at a moment to articulate their thoughts in a coherent manner when the political climate of the region was quite daunting. Concluding his stimulating session Dr Dey encouraged young scholars to undertake more serious research on Sufism in Bengal and through such localized intensive study add to the domain of historical study in more thought provoking ways. Dr. Ipshita Halder concentrated on the influence of Sufi thought on the language and literature of Bengal. For the Thirteenth century Sufi poet Rumi, 'Love is my religion; Only on the horse of love can you go beyond the sun and the moon to behold the Perfect One; It is this message of unconditional love that inspired the religious rejuvenation of Shri Chaitanya or Meera Bai, or even Guru Nanak, resulting in the inclusion of Sufi verses in Guru Granth Sahib. Dr. Halder pointed out that although translating the Quran was strictly prohibited initially, and how it took centuries to publish a Bangla version. She read out very interesting extracts to show how the Islamic missionaries eventually adopted a very Sanskritized register to communicate with the people of Bengal. Rabindranath possibly imbibed his love of Sufi poetry from his father, Debendranath, who was fond of Hafiz. He was instrumental in encouraging Kshitimohan Sen to rediscover the medieval saints and poets, thereby opening up the world of Sufi ideas to the twentieth century readers. Dr. Halder paid

glowing tributes to the Bauls of Bengal, among whom Lalan Fakir, is possibly the best known, whose profound philosophy owes much to the Sufi tradition.

- Objective of the event: Critical and creative methodologies across disciplines and knowledge systems have regularly interacted with each other, thus reconfiguring their own perspectives, positions, and politics. Interdisciplinary exercises have led to dialogues between natural science and humanities and the social sciences too. The latter has thus had diverse avenues to reorient themselves and undertake afresh inquiries into their epistemological and practical



developments. The FDP envisions familiarizing faculties and research scholars with the emerging trends, perspectives, and methods in humanities and social science research and how these can constitute reconfirming the pedagogies of different disciplines.

- Brief description of the event: The Faculty Development Programme (FDP) envisions the development of faculties and researchers through familiarizing them with recent trends and methodologies of different fields of academia. The Bhawanipur Education Society College has always been keen to reconfigure the perspective of its faculties and students as per development of diverse avenues of knowledge. Recently from 11 to 20th Dec. 2023, an FDP was organized on 'Research in Humanities and Social Sciences: Methodologies, Perspectives, and Dialogue' by BESC and Ramakrishna Mission (Rahara), where a wide range of topics was discussed by dignitaries from different disciplines both in online and offline mode. There were 17 offline and 10 online sessions. In 10 days of FDP, a total of 36 panellists shared their views with audiences. Total number of registered participants was 65. More audiences kept visiting the FDP at times to widen their epistemological periphery. This FDP, whose coordinator and joint coordinator were Mr. Tathagata Sen and Dr. Kasturi Mukherjee, respectively from BESC, started with the inaugural keynote address on the topic of digital archives by Prof. Avijit Gupta (Jadavpur University). This reflected the urgent need for archival facilities and know-how in the digitization of documents in the academic arena. Dr. Suman Mukherjee's speech on 'developing self' was very captivating and helped reorient the audience's perspective about research aptitudes and self-management.

- In Humanities and Social studies, a large section of discourse is covered by women studies and the feminist approach, which has been meticulously intimated by Prof. Rekha Pandey and Dr. Debdutta Chaudhuri in two different sessions. Prof. Biswajit Roy, and Prof. Amitava Chakrabarty pointed out our concerns towards the literary texts as the major sources of social dynamics and its varied interpretations with the changing paradigms. In this line, there is a growing importance of cross-cultural translations which have been vividly elaborated by Prof. Chinmoy Guha who has been in this field for decades. Research exercise in social science is changing rapidly with time. Hence its various dimensions like fieldwork, research ethics, etc. have been highlighted by Mr. M. Togowa, Dr. Debashis Majumder, Mr. M. Keshav, Dr. Shiladitya Chattopadhyay, and so on. An eminent historian from JNU, Prof. Kunal Chakraborty shared his views and research on deconstruction and reconstruction of our traditional texts which are the foundation of our heritage and culture. Modern research in humanities and social sciences nowadays is highly supported by Technology and Artificial Intelligence (AI) which has changed the interface of the way research is conducted. Dr. Subhajit Das and Prof. Arjun Ghosh made participants familiar with some modern software-based technology that can reduce human manual efforts and expedite both qualitative and quantitative research works. The FDP was very fruitful for the participants in many ways, and on the last day, a successful valedictory session was followed by the distribution of certificates to the participants.
- Outcome of the event: Become familiar with the fundamentals of Social Science & Humanities research. How to write a research/review

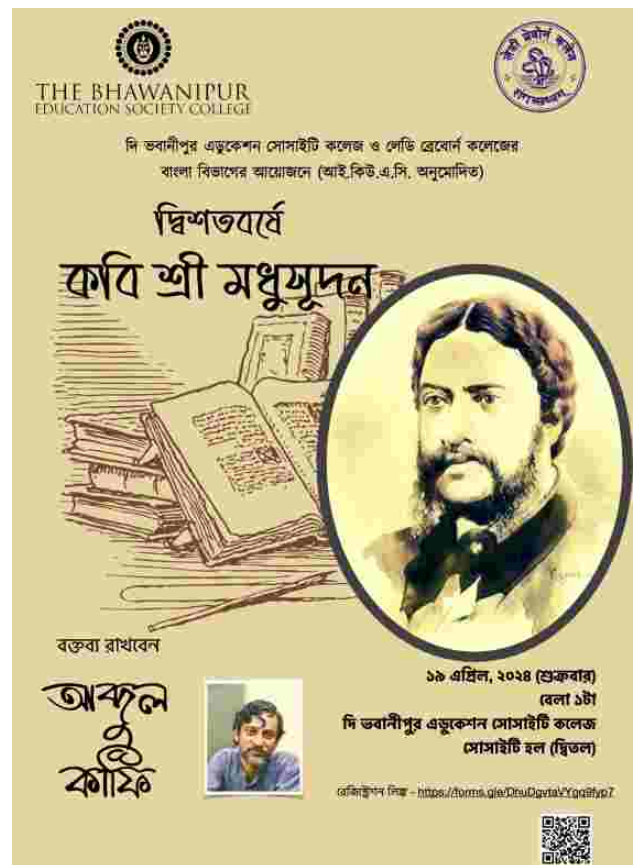

Society College looks forward to organizing more such events that contribute to the holistic development of its students. Participation certificates were distributed among the students to motivate them.

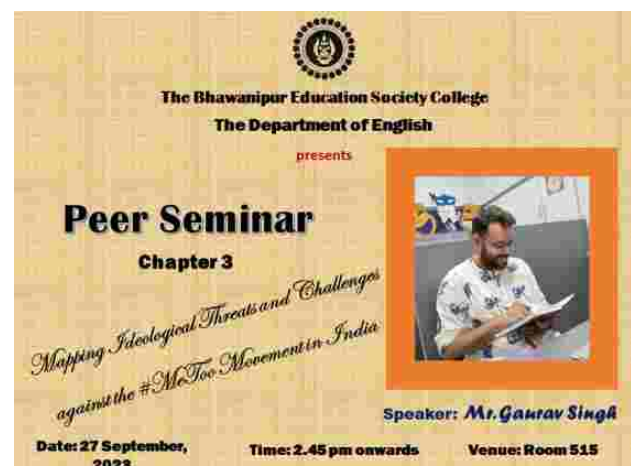

Peer seminar continues to be a unique endeavour by the Department of English in order to encourage a promising atmosphere for research and the exchange of scholarly ideas. It serves to enrich faculty members and students alike through the facilitation of critical thinking and dialogue.

- Brief description of the event: The Department of English, The Bhawanipur Education Society College organised Peer Seminar: Chapter 3 on 27th September, 2023 at 3 pm. The speaker was Prof. Gaurav Singh; his paper was entitled "Mapping Ideological Threats and Challenges against the #MeToo Movement in India". The seminar was held in Room 515 from 3 pm; it was attended by faculty members, PG Semester III students along with a few UG Semester V students of the Department of English. Prof. Singh spoke about the #MeToo Movement, a watershed movement in the arena of postmodern intersectional feminism prominently known for creating a discourse and narrative of women survivors of sexual assault and other forms of gender-based violence. 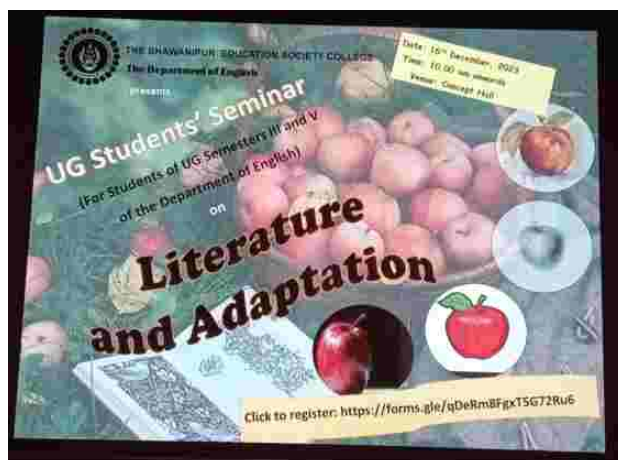

  - Objective of the event: The primary objective of the seminar was to enable the students to independently explore the varied dimensions of literary adaptations and to initiate a forum for dialogue, discussion, and debate. Paper presenters were encouraged to submit original

papers critically deliberating on the nuanced layers of literary adaptations, assess the range of adaptations and figure out the limits of adaptability distinguishing good from poor retellings.

- Brief description of the event: Ms. Neetisha Jha and Ms. Chitrangada Deb of the Department of English, convened the Student's Seminar with enthusiastic support from the teachers and the students of the department. The Head of the Department, Dr. Gargi Talapatra declared the Seminar open with her encouraging welcome note. A total of 21 student speakers were judged by a panel of in-house judges comprising Prof Ananyya Banerjee, Dr. Jashomati Ghose and Prof Sonal Kapur. There were four sessions, with a Q/A round at the end of each session. The fourth volume of 'Thoughtspell', the students' magazine of the English department was also introduced. The seminar concluded with the prize distribution ceremony and the Valedictory session.
- Outcome of the event: The art of animating literature from word to visuals has greatly enriched interdisciplinary research and diverse creative pursuits. Films, theatre, television, OTT and video games have greatly relied on literary sources. An authentic reproduction can positively transform the source text, aptly



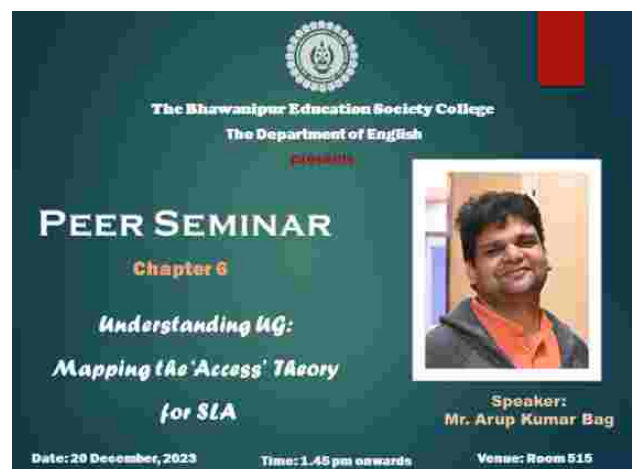

This has been instituted as an attempt to encourage academic dialogue and widen research perspectives amongst the faculty. Peer seminar continues to be a unique endeavour by the Department of English in order to encourage a promising atmosphere for research and the exchange of scholarly ideas. It serves to enrich faculty members and students alike through the facilitation of critical thinking and dialogue.
- Brief description of the event: The speaker was Mr. Arup Kumar Bag; his paper was entitled- "Understanding UG: Mapping the 'Access' Theory for SLA". The seminar took place in room no. 515, and was attended by the faculty members and the PG Semester III students of the Department of English. Mr. Bag began his presentation by locating the discourse of language acquisition in terms of L1, L2, and TL [Target Language]. His presentation probed deeper into the Chomskian legacy of 'Innate approach' and how language is biologically 'predetermined' through the LAD. Chomskian





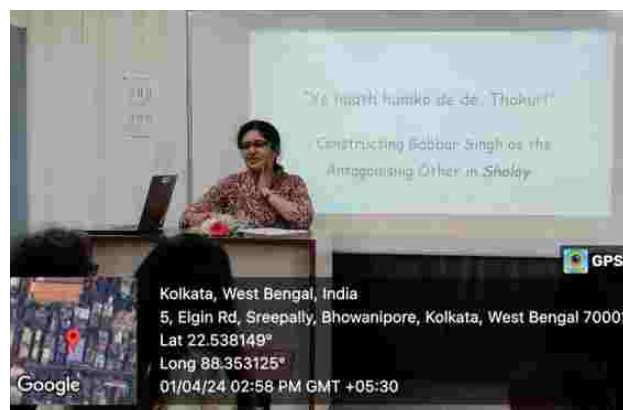


paradigm shifted its focus from LAD to UG where Chomsky believed that it is presupposed that the linguistic competence of native speakers of a language can be accounted for in terms of an abstract and unconscious linguistic system, in other words, a grammar, which underlies the use of language which he termed later as UG. Mr. Bag commented on the four important hypotheses of UG developed chronologically by different scholars- The Minimal Trees Hypothesis: developed by A. Vainikka and M.Young Scholten in 1994; The Full Transfer Full Access Hypothesis developed B. Schwartz and R. Sprouse in 1996; The Valueless Features Hypothesis developed by L. Eubank in 1996; and The Full Access (Without Transfer) Hypothesis by S. Flynn, G. Martohardjono, and S. Epstein in 1996.

- Outcome of the event: Mr. Bag's presentation ended with a discussion where he addressed the recent developments in SLA theories in terms of UG and the problems associated with it. He also tried to enhance the interest in students by giving them examples from our day-to-day life and how these linguistic structures get registered in our schema without our realization.

### 1. Name of the Activity: Annual Student Seminar entitled 'Secessionism in the Modern World'

- Type of Activity: Student Seminar
- Date/ Duration of Activity (from - to): 11.05.2024
- Time: 10:30 am to 1:30 pm
- Details of Resource Person: Prof. Siddhartha Guha Roy, University of Calcutta
- No of Participants: 43 students including students from Semester 4 and Semester 6, Department of History, departments of Political Science and Journalism and Mass Communication and faculties from the Department of History, Political Science and Bengali.
- Objective of the Event: The Annual Student Seminar was organized with an intent to develop critical thinking faculties of the



students aligning with early forays into research. They are encouraged to frame independent research questions, traversing social, cultural, political and economic dimensions of a historical process.

- Brief Description of the Event: The event started off with a welcome address chaired by Professor Anindya Sen and Head of the Department Professor Piu Chatterjee and Debjani Ganguly welcoming Prof. Guha Roy. Formally, the event began with a keynote address delving into the interconnections between Secessionism, Terrorism and Nationalism. The topics covered an entire range of important historical events, like the Bangladesh Liberation War, India's Role in Bangladesh's Liberation and the snowballing of the Bhasha Andolan. The next paper presented was on the socio-religious, political, cultural demands of the Khalistani movement. The subsequent paper was on the political evolution of Kashmir from its integration into the Indian Nation state through the Instrument of Accession till the current political scenario and its cascading effects with the abrogation of Article 370. From Kashmir to Bengal, how can one study Brahmoism in the nineteenth century as a secessionist movement in the cultural domain? To what extent does media and journalistic ethics influence the perception of war with special reference to Gaza and the larger Israel- Palestinian movement? The following papers offered a macro perspective of the religious tensions creating rifts between the Sinhalese Buddhists and Tamils till the assassination attempts carried out on Rajiv Gandhi, illustrating the varied perspectives of the Sri Lankan crisis, with the larger context of its recent economic meltdown. The next set of papers focused on the situation of Communal Tensions in the twentieth century with the



specific role played by the RSS. The use of literature as an effective primary source, utilizing both the fiction and the non-fiction, what have been the various ways in which historians have studied the Partition of India. The final paper through the effective use of film as a primary source spoke about the genesis of the Naxalite movement and traced the heady days of Bengal, soaked in the prevailing Naxalite movement.

- Outcome of the Event: The outcome of the trip was to equip students' educational and research skills. By focusing on topics of their choice they have been encouraged to develop research questions. Papers were assessed by Professor Guha Roy and he gave valuable feedback to the students about the varied forms in which Secessionism takes place in the Modern World- from socio-religious concerns, political ambitions, economic demands, to ethnic and communal consciousness.
- Conclusion: The Annual Student was a success, with the Department choosing the best papers and encouraging students to seek prospects of publishing in the near future.

work with this software and there has been a positive demand for a more advanced workshop in R in the future.

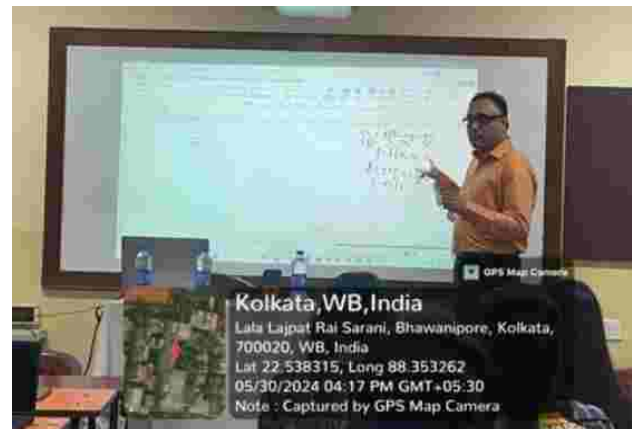

## 2. Name of the Activity: "Molecular Interaction in Space: In the Light of Physics and Chemistry"

- No. of Participants: 74
- Objective of the event: The International Seminar was organized jointly by both the departments of Physics and Chemistry to discuss the interaction of molecules in space. It was divided into two sessions. The first session aimed to introduce the mechanism of creation of molecular components in space and the second session aimed to introduce the action and the nature of fundamental forces. The second session conducted a total review of particle physics at the undergraduate level. These sessions were arranged to stimulate the students' interest in molecular science and to apprise them of important theoretical developments in the field.
- Brief Description of the Event: The molecular interactions in the view of chemical sciences were discussed in the first session under the topic 'Molecular astrophysics: Quantum Chemical perspective on molecular synthesis in the astrophysical environment' by Dr. Partha Pratim Bera. Dr. Bera discussed that low-density matter that exists in the space between stars in a galaxy consists of gas and dust, and within these environments, molecules are formed through various processes. Molecular clouds, which are dense regions, play a crucial role in star formation. The outer atmospheres of

stars, especially cool and evolved stars, are rich in molecular species. Quantum chemistry provides insights into the formation of complex organic molecules in these regions. Fundamental reactions of organic molecules that lead to the buildup of simple prebiotic molecules in various astrophysical environments such as the interstellar medium, star-forming regions, protoplanetary disks, and bodies in our solar system was discussed. The physical interactions at the level of subatomic particles were discussed by Dr. Anindya Datta in the second session under the topic "Looking for the invisible: The Ultimate Adventure!". The very basics of the standard model, the enigma of dark matter, and dark energies were discussed.

- Outcome of the Event: The students enjoyed the presentations and gained considerable domain knowledge from their interactions with the resource persons.

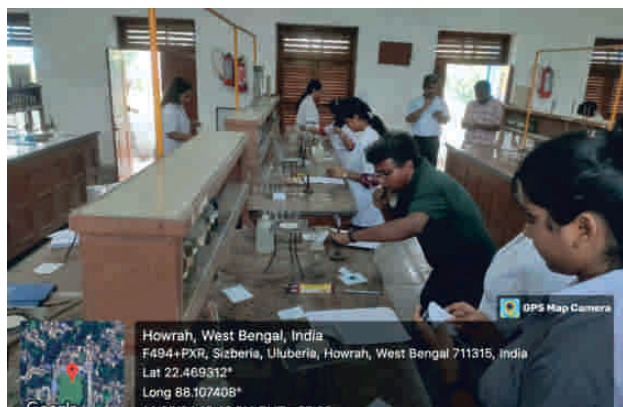

- Brief description of the event: To explore the potential of blockchain in the academic bank of credit, a seminar on Blockchain-Powered Academic Bank of Credit for the Educational Institutes was jointly organized by the

Department of Computer Science and the Department of BBA on September 30, 2023, at the 6th-floor concept hall of our college. The seminar was coordinated by Dr. Pinki Saha Sardar, Vice Principal (Science Section) and Dr. Tridip Sengupta, Coordinator (BBA Department) under the guidance of Dr. Suman K. Mukherjee, Director General. The conveners of the seminar were Mr. Utsab Mukherjee, Faculty of the department of Computer Science and Ms. Sutapa Banik, Faculty of the department of BBA. The event commenced with a welcoming address by Dr. Mukerjee. Subsequently, Mr. Rohhit Tandon, CEO of Yoonify, along with Mr. R.K. Chhajjer, Regional President of the Indo-American Chamber of Commerce, delivered a talk on the significance of Blockchain in the context of the academic bank of credit.

A blockchain is a decentralized and transparent digital ledger technology that records





transactions across multiple computers, ensuring security and immutability. It comprises a chain of blocks, each containing a group of transactions, safeguarded by cryptographic security and consensus mechanisms to maintain data integrity and decentralization. Originally designed for tracking cryptographic transactions, it has since demonstrated its potential in various domains, including education, healthcare, and efficient farming. In an increasingly corrupt world, securing academic information is crucial for students. Blockchain technology offers a solution in the form of an “academic bank of credit; in the educational sector. This system incorporates encryption, with one key accessible to the student and the other held by the organization, preventing third-party access. It aligns with the National Education Policy (NEP-2020) and tracks academic degrees and diplomas through hashing, enhancing security even within a credit transfer system. Our college, The BESC, foresaw the importance of such a decentralized system ahead of the university and has partnered with Yoonify, a multinational company specializing in decentralized systems in the Ed-tech and financial sectors.

- Outcome of the event: The event resulted in both teachers and students gaining a profound understanding of the immense potential of blockchain technology within the academic realm. They grasped how it could revolutionize the management of academic credits. The session also provided students with a deep insight into blockchain and its practical applications in handling academic credit banks, facilitated by an engaging question and answer segment that left them enlightened and inspired.

### 1. Name of the Activity: R in Social Sciences - A Comprehensive Roadmap to Research and Practical Implementation

- No. of Participants: 41 (including 16 participants from different institutions)
- Objective of the workshop: The workshop was primarily organized with the following objectives in mind:
  - a. Familiarise participants with research methodology and research ethics.
  - b. Introduce participants to R packages relevant to their field of interest, particularly in commerce, economics and other social sciences.
  - c. Provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of R and its capabilities for data analysis.
  - d. Equip participants with essential skills to handle, clean, manipulate, analyse and visualize data using R.
  - e. Familiarise participants with statistical techniques and inferential testing using R.
  - f. Enable participants to apply R to real-world datasets and problems.



- **Brief description of the event:** The Department of Commerce UG (Afternoon & Evening Section), PG and the Department of Economics in collaboration with the IQAC of the college, in August 2024, organised a five-day National Workshop titled R in Social Sciences - A Comprehensive Roadmap to Research and Practical Implementation. This workshop, held between 8th and 12th August, 2024, was sponsored by ICSSR - ERC. The workshop focused on two distinct areas - (i) research methodology and ethics, (ii) hands on training in R language. Over this period of 5 days, eminent resource persons - Prof. Amalendu Bhunia, Vice Chancellor & Professor of Commerce, University of Kalyani, Dr. Sumanta Dutta, Post Graduate amp; Research, Department of Commerce, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata, Dr. Neelanjan Sircar, Senior Fellow, Centre for Policy Research and Assistant Professor, Ashoka University and Mr. Sabir Ahamed, National Research Coordinator, Pratichi Trust, deliberated on various aspects of R. 41 (including 16 from other institutions in Kolkata) and faculty members from the Economics fraternity participated in the workshop.
- **Outcome of the event:** The expected outcomes of the workshop were that the participants will gain a comprehensive understanding of R's capabilities and will be able to handle, manipulate, and analyze data effectively. They will be able to develop proficiency in using R functions, packages, and techniques for data exploration, transformation, and cleaning. Participants will learn how to apply statistical techniques and perform inferential testing using R and will acquire skills in creating visually appealing data representation. It was also the goal of the workshop to help

participants gain insights into the relevance and importance of data analysis and statistical computing in research, particularly in the field of social science. The expected outcomes of the workshop were that the participants will gain a comprehensive understanding of R's capabilities and will be able to handle, manipulate, and analyze data effectively. They will be able to develop proficiency in using R functions, packages, and techniques for data exploration, transformation, and cleaning. Participants will learn how to apply statistical techniques and perform inferential testing using R and will acquire skills in creating visually appealing data representation. The feedback from the participants indicated that the expected outcomes had been achieved. The feedback from the participants indicated that they have developed the confidence in using R as a versatile tool for data analysis and statistical computing. The workshop has been able to impart the basic knowledge required to work with this software and there has been a positive demand for a more advanced workshop in R in the future.





2. On 26th April 2024, the Department of Economics organized a one-day Workshop on MS Excel (Following the University of Calcutta CCF Syllabus). The adoption of New Education Policy 2020 by the state of West Bengal has led to the introduction of a new syllabus in all streams of undergraduate study in the University of Calcutta under the Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF, 2022). In view of this, the newly introduced four-year Economics Honours course has included MS Excel as part of its undergraduate syllabus. Students studying Economics will be tested on the Excel spreadsheet software in the second semester itself. Excel being an extensive and overarching software, it becomes necessary that the different colleges affiliated to the University of Calcutta adopt a common instruction methodology. In view of this the workshop was organized by the department, and the target audience was the Economics faculty from different affiliated colleges of the University of Calcutta. Prof Sudakshina Gupta, Chairperson, UGBoS (Economics), University of Calcutta was the chief guest, while Dr Shirsendu Mukherjee, Associate Professor, St Paul's Cathedral Mission College and Member of the UGBoS (Economics), University of Calcutta was the resource person for the event. After a brief inauguration programme the actual workshop commenced. Dr Mukherjee conducted a 5-hour

hands-on session wherein he discussed the various features of the Excel spreadsheet. - Details of Resource Persons: Sri Debajyoti Dhar (Scientist and Deputy Director), Dr. Jolly Dhar (Group Director of Microwave Sensors Receiver Group both from Space Applications Centre (SAC), ISRO Ahmedabad Centre).
- No. of Participants: 57 Teachers and Staff and 223 Students
- Objective of the event: The event was organized to make people aware of Moon Mission: Chandrayaan-3 and the technicalities regarding the different techniques for soft landing.
- Brief description of the event: In the first session, Sri Debojyoti Dhar shared his experience on India & Moon Mission: Chandrayaan-3 and Computer Vision as AI/ML/DL applications. He explained the Chandrayaan-1 and Chandrayaan-2 missions through the associated instruments and images to create a knowledge base and thereafter, emphasized on Chandrayaan-3. Different techniques employed for soft landing were explained by him. Some video clips were also presented related to the deployment of the





Pragyan Rover. In addition to this, he appreciated the fact that all the instruments were designed and fabricated in India highlighting our country's potential to excel indigenously. He, then, made some digressions and discussed a deep learning model known as Generative Adversarial Network which is essentially used to recognize wet lands at higher resolution based on missing data reconstruction. In the second session, Dr. Jolly Dhar, elaborated on the RADAR sensors used at ISRO for civilian and planetary missions. Discussing the multiple dimensions of ISRO's space programs, she emphasized that all these aspects are the fruits of labour of the passionate professionals who have gathered from different disciplines to build a nation and scale new heights. She talked about the Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR) and a consequent built up of the Earth Observation Space-borne SAR made in India. Further, she iterated on the collaboration of ISRO with NASA on SAR for natural ecosystems and coastal regions for oceanographic studies. She ended her session by sharing the roadmap for the futuristic Terahertz technology which is being viewed as the next big project that ISRO would embark upon. The third and final session was an interactive round where both the speakers interacted directly with the audience. The students, especially, were inquisitive enough to ask nuanced and thoughtful questions to the resource persons who, with great humour and patience, answered each and every query to the audience's delight. The speakers talked at great length on the career and job opportunities at ISRO and were also visibly engaged with the audience in answering their queries.

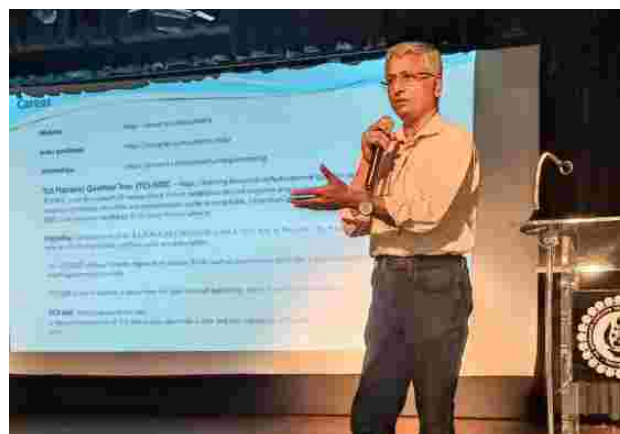
- Outcome of the event: 280 participants comprising students, teachers and laboratory

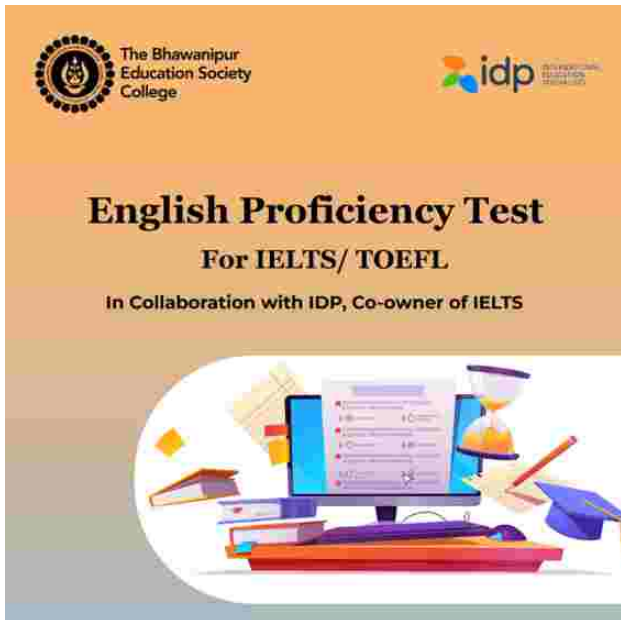

### 31. Event Name: Math Magic

**Date: 22nd March, 2024**

The Bhawanipur Education Society College hosted "Math-Magic", a session for interested students on solving everyday mathematical problems in fun and simple ways. The event was headed by Mr. Debdeep Chakraborty, Chief Mentor of IMS Kolkata, with over 19 years of experience having mentored over 10k mentees. The presentation began with him explaining to students the importance of knowing basic math and how mathematics affects the different spheres of our daily lives like calculating taxes, investments, loans, wealth and expense management, etc. He spoke briefly on professions that pivot entirely on the fluent knowledge of mathematics such as chartered accountancy, sales management, financial management, marketing management, etc. He then taught the students the shortcuts for calculating basic problems with the help of early Vedic math rules that were developed in ancient India. The explanations were delivered in a simplified manner such that even students with

negligible mathematics background were able to grasp the concepts without much difficulty. Next up was a fun timed test with 11 questions, each different from the other, to be solved by students under 30 seconds. His session ended, and he gave a final tip to the students to approach daily mathematics without trepidation and to study books on early Vedic mathematics.

### 32. Event Name: Workshop on Odoo - Making companies a better place with one app at a time

**Date: 3rd April, 2024**

The Bhawanipur Education Society College held a workshop on "Odoo", an ERP Software used for various business activities of a firm. The workshop was presided by CA Shivam Davda on the 3rd April, 2024 at the Society Hall from 12.30 P.M. to 2.30 P.M. The major aim of the workshop was to initiate the students and the attendees about different financial activities, accounting being one of their main works in Odoo and how can the students make use of it in their daily lives. The workshop commenced with the felicitation of Mr. Davda by Mr. Dilip Shah, Rector & Dean of Student Affairs. Mr. Davda began briefly by over-viewing the software and notifying all the key statistics in it; talked of its history and origin in Belgium, its steady evolution over the years, its uses in 71 countries across the world & its dedicated branch offices in fourteen countries with its Indian





headquarters located at Gandhinagar, Gujarat. He went on to exemplify the different organizations associated with performing their financial duties through Odoo: The Somnath Temple of Gujarat and Isha Foundation of Coimbatore being few notable examples. In the next one hour he provided the students with a live demonstration session where he showed them the dedicated financial modules of respective countries and the methods of finding out accounting transactions, creating accounting statements like sales invoice and evaluation of financial mathematics like that of taxation. Followed by this was the demonstration of standard technicalities to access data like Balance sheets, calculation of TDS, and Bank statements. Lastly, he enumerated the processes behind evaluating the different types of financial bills starting from Vendor bills to Trade bills.

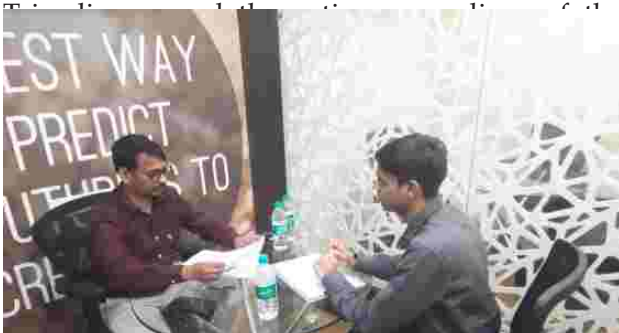

etiquette for an interview such as opening with a greeting and maintaining a correct body posture. In the other half of the workshop, she discussed the best practices, and the do's and don'ts in an interview that can make or break the chances of getting selected. She furthermore pointed out the need for preparation in an online interview which included having a quiet place, dressing formally, and having a high-speed internet connection. Finally, she imparted to students a list of questions that could be asked during the interview and advised them to prepare the answers in advance.

The event was initiated by an introductory speech delivered by Prof Chitrangada Deb, following which the panel of judges- Dr Gargi Talapatra, Prof Sonal Kapur and Dr Jashomati Ghose were felicitated. The seminar on laughter and literature was intended to enable students to study and appreciate laughter as a literary artifact and a critical tool, and also to become more aware of the humorous aspect of life and literature.

## DEPARTMENT - HISTORY

### 1. Name of the Activity: Annual Student Seminar entitled Secessionism in the Modern World

- Type of Activity: The Activity was Annual Student Seminar which is conducted annually by the Department to encourage students to think independently, to inculcate skills necessary for a researcher.
- Date/ Duration of Activity (from - to): 11th May 2024
- Time: 10:30 AM - 1:30 PM
- Details of Resource Person: The Department had invited Professor Siddhartha Guha Roy, of the University of Calcutta to act as the chief guest.
- No of Participants: 43 students including students from Semester 4 and Semester 6, Department of History, departments of Political Science and Journalism and Mass Communication and faculties from the





Department of History, Political Science and Bengali.

- Objective of the Event: The Annual Student Seminar was organized with an intent to develop critical thinking faculties of the students aligning with early forays into research. They are encouraged to frame independent research questions, traversing social, cultural, political and economic dimensions of a historical process.
- Brief Description of the Event: The event started off with a welcome address chaired by Professor Anindya Sen and Head of the Department Professor Piu Chatterjee and Debjani Ganguly welcoming Professor Guha Roy. Formally, the event began with a keynote address delving into the interconnections between Secessionism, Terrorism and Nationalism. The topics covered an entire range of important historical events, like the Bangladesh Liberation War, India's Role in Bangladesh's Liberation and the snowballing of the Bhasha Andolan. The next paper presented was on the socio-religious, political, cultural demands of the Khalistani movement. The subsequent paper was on the political evolution of Kashmir from its integration into the Indian Nation state through the Instrument of Accession till the current political scenario and its cascading effects with the abrogation of Article 370. From Kashmir to Bengal, how can one study Brahmoism in the nineteenth century as a secessionist movement in the cultural domain? To what extent does media and journalistic ethics influence the perception of war with special reference to Gaza and the larger Israel- Palestinian movement? The following papers offered a macro perspective of the religious tensions creating rifts between the Sinhalese Buddhists and Tamils till the

assassination attempts carried out on Rajiv Gandhi, illustrating the varied perspectives of the Sri Lankan crisis, with the larger context of its recent economic meltdown. The next set of papers focused on the situation of Communal Tensions in the twentieth century with the specific role played by the RSS. The use of literature as an effective primary source, utilizing both the fiction and the non-fiction, what have been the various ways in which historians have studied the Partition of India. The final paper through the effective use of film as a primary source spoke about the genesis of the Naxalite movement and traced the heady days of Bengal, soaked in the prevailing Naxalite movement.

- Outcome of the Event: The outcome of the trip was to equip students' educational and research skills. By focusing on topics of their choice they have been encouraged to develop research questions. Papers were assessed by Professor Guha Roy and he gave valuable feedback to the students about the varied forms in which Secessionism takes place in the Modern World- from socio-religious concerns, political ambitions, economic demands, to ethnic and communal consciousness.
- Conclusion: The Annual Student was a success, with the Department choosing the best papers and encouraging students to seek prospects of publishing in the near future.

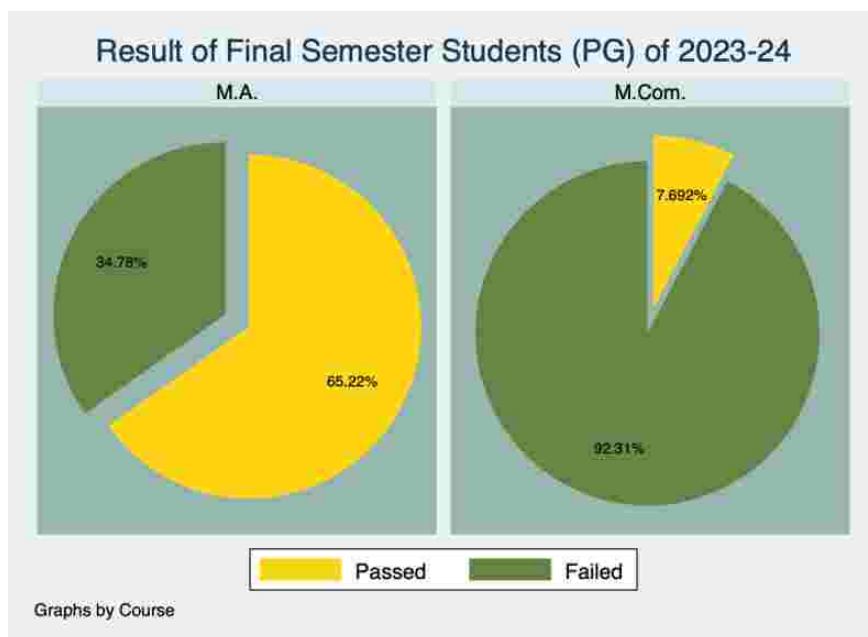
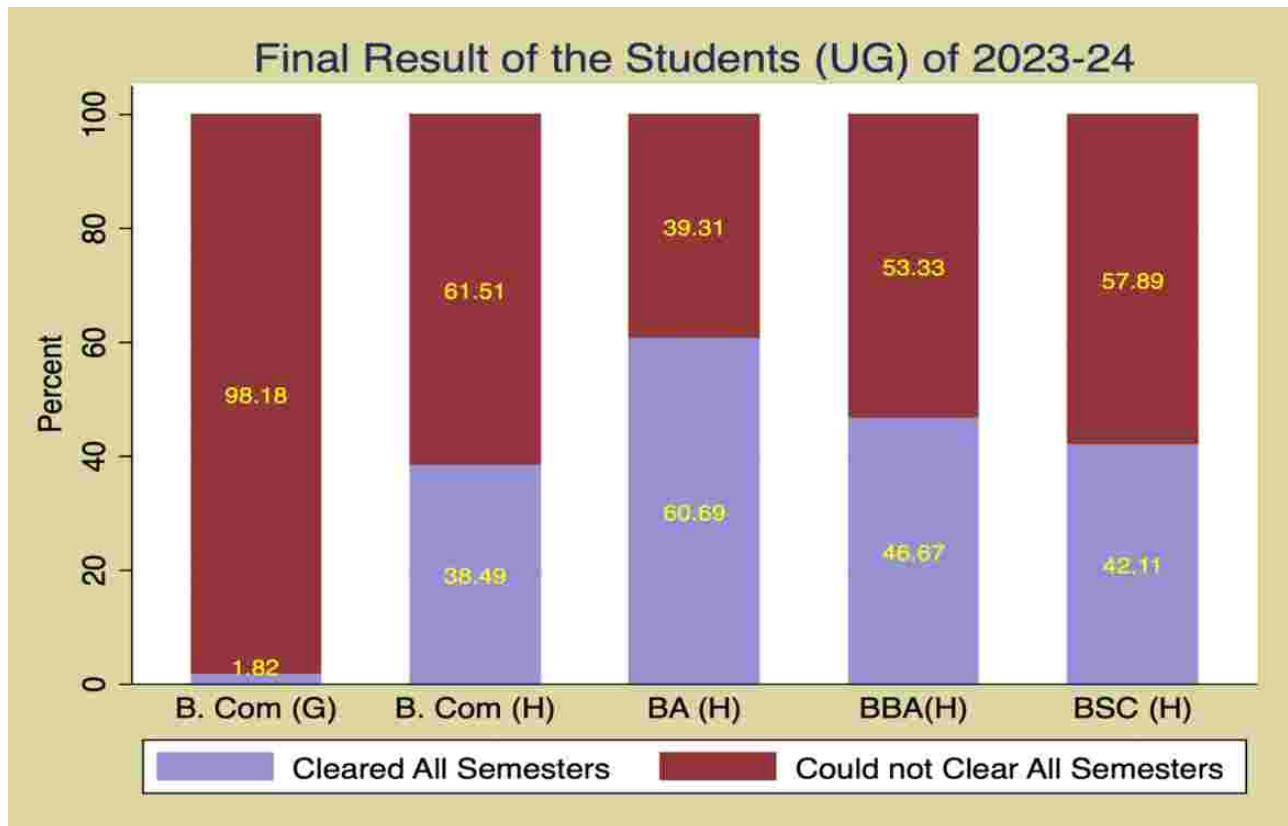

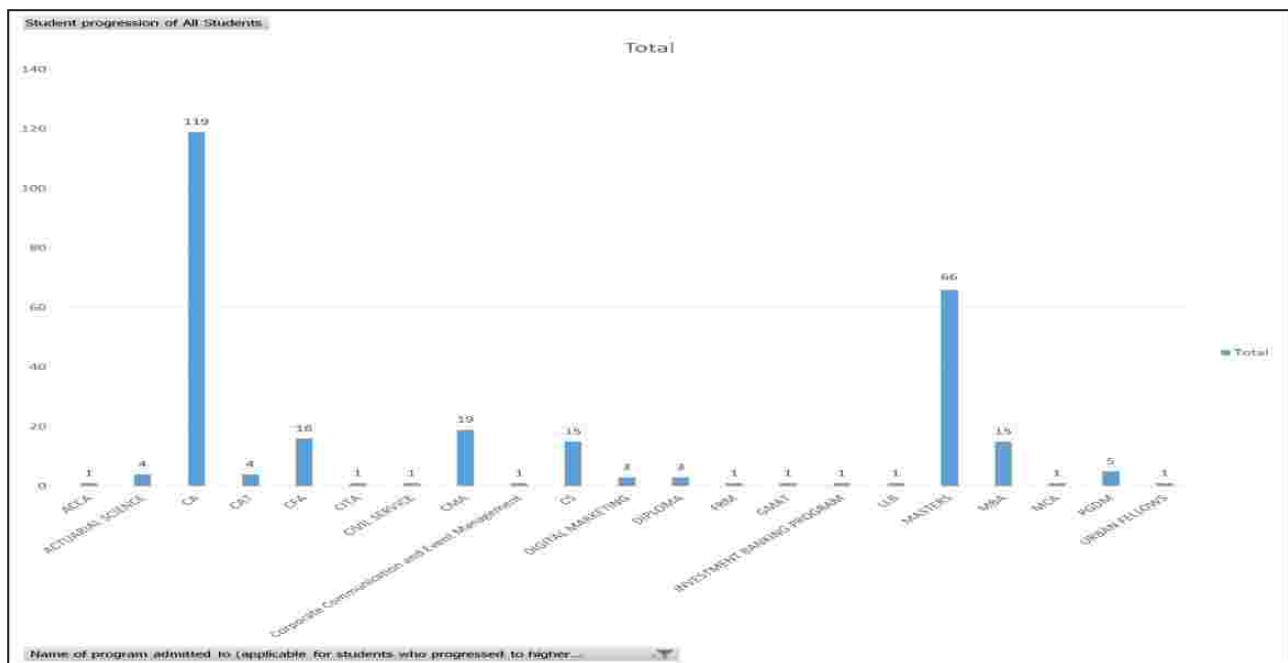

rendition of the famous song 'Ami Banglay gan Gai'. The day drew to an end with a play enacted by the students of the college drama troupe -Antarjaal.

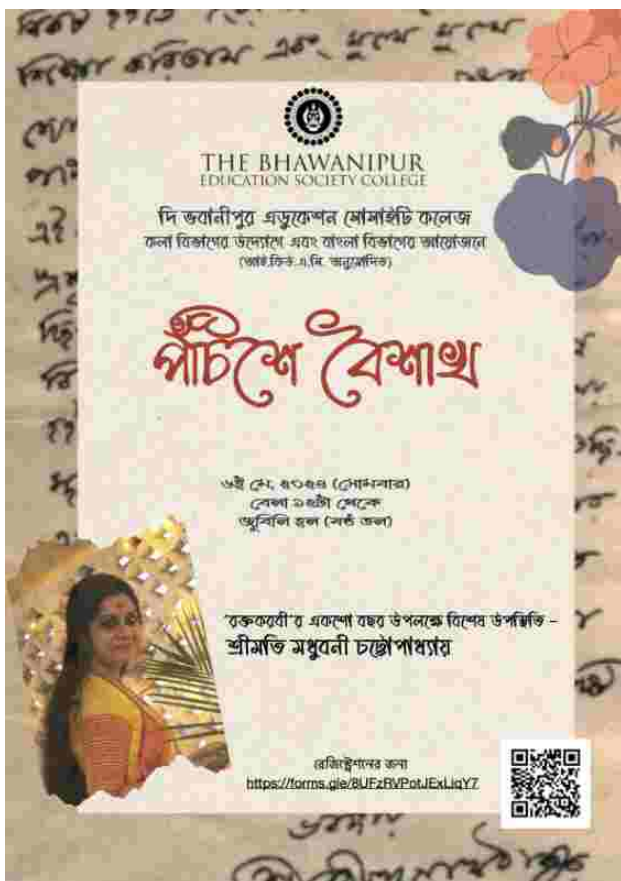

Day 4 (27.09.2023) - Rabindra Sarobar, Rash Behari Avenue, Quest Mall Area, Lansdowne Area, South City Mall Area - visited 347 residences. The initiative aimed to create a sense of responsibility amongst the youth and make people aware of the importance of water and how to save it.

Prof. Mukherjee talked about how dermatological problems like skin acne and hives commonly arise in women due to hormonal imbalances and improper diet. #### 1. Name of the Activity: Field Trip to Alipore Museum

- Category of Activity: Extension Programme
- Organising Unit: Department of Political Science
- Date of Activity: 01.12.2023
- Time: 10 AM onwards
- No. of Participants: Teachers - 4 and students - 89
- Objective of the event: This field trip is indispensable for the purpose of semester 3 tutorial, which is an essential component of Calcutta University Examinations. The trip was organised to enable the students to have a

comprehensive understanding of different phases of the independence movement, the role and contribution of the freedom fighters in the freedom movement.

- Brief description of the event: The Alipore Central Correctional Home is a national historic landmark located in the heart of Kolkata. This 116 year old building, along with the Presidency Jail, is on the Grade I list of heritage sites of Kolkata. Constructed in 1906, and spread over 15.2 acres, this colonial era institution abuts Tolly's Nullah and can be identified easily with its characteristic brick-red walls. Within the premises one can spot the Alipore Jail Press Building, the central watchtower, over a dozen buildings which served as prison cells and wards, and the Alipore Jail Hospital building. Notable freedom fighters who were incarcerated here include Jawaharlal Nehru, Subhash Chandra Bose, Chittaranjan Das, Dinesh Gupta, Dr Bidhan Chandra Roy to name a few. It served as a correctional home till 2019. From being a silent witness to the brutalities inflicted on the freedom fighters of the country, the Alipore Central Correctional Home is now transformed as a memorial and museum to honour the sacrifice of those who fought for the independence of India. The existing Alipore jail campus adopted a world-class Independence museum. The Independence Museum displays events of India's freedom struggle during the



British period. The museum also has on its display, paintings, photographs, maps of India during the various periods of history, installations and statues of the freedom fighters. Other than this, the museum also displays letters, documents and artifacts related to the freedom struggle. The Department of Political Science organised a field trip on 1st December, 2023 to Alipore Museum for the students of Semester III. A total of 89 students accompanied by 4 teachers visited the Alipore Museum. The students visited the museum and intensely observed the displayed items with great attention and interest.

- Outcome of the event: The field trip was a success as the students had a detailed understanding of the different phases and events of the independence movement and the selfless sacrifice of the freedom fighters in their struggle for freedom.

organized to enable the students to have a comprehensive understanding of the structure and functions of Kolkata Municipal Corporation.

- Brief description of the event: The Department of Political Science organised an academic trip to Kolkata Municipal Corporation on 1st April, 2024 for the students of Semester 6. A total of 48 students accompanied by 5 teachers visited the main office of KMC, situated in New Market Area. The KMC officials very gladly received the students and provided them with welcome drinks and refreshments. The students visited the Mayor's room, House and Councillors' Club. The students attended the following interactive sessions conducted by top-ranking KMC officials.

- Mr. Saikat Dasgupta, Chief Manager, Personnel and Health, discussed the structure and functions of KMC.
- Mr. Mainak Mukherjee, DG, Water Supply explained the process of filtration and supply of water.

#### 6. Name of the Activity: Field Trip to Netaji Bhawan

- Date of Activity: 02.04.2024
- Time: 11:00 AM
- No. of Participants: Teachers – 3 and students - 51
- Objective of the event: The political thought of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose is a part of the syllabus. So, the field trip enabled the students to have a comprehensive understanding of the life, work and contribution of Netaji Subhash Chandra to Indian political thought.
- Brief description of the event: The Department of Political Science organised a field trip to Netaji Bhawan for the students of Semester IV. A total of 47 students accompanied by 4 teachers visited the ancestral house of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. They witnessed the German-made Wanderer car that was used by Netaji in his escape from India in January 1941. They even saw Netaji's bedroom and the office used by him as Congress President (1938-1939) with the walls painted in tricolour and the charkha at one side of his desk, preserved just the way it was left before his escape. The students explored the galleries of the museum that document Netaji's life as an adolescent, as a student in Cambridge and as an ambassador of the Indian freedom movement in Europe in the 1930s. They got a glimpse into his journey in

Europe between 1941- 43 through various photographs clicked in Germany, including one with Hitler. The Asia Room documented the last lap of Netaji's role in Indian independence, as the commander of the Indian National Army in Singapore.

- Outcome of the event: The field trip was a success as the students were fascinated by the life and times of Netaji and also gained an insight into the political scenario at the time of the Indian freedom movement that shaped Netaji's political ideas.

### 1. Name of the Activity: Industrial Visit to Amul Macho Factory

- Category of Activity: Extension Programme
- Organising Unit: Department of BBA
- Date of Activity: 08.09.2023
- Time: 10:50 AM - 5 PM
- No. of Participants: Teachers – 2 and students - 43
- Objective of the Activity: To make students aware about different verticals and functions of garments industry
- Brief Description of the Activity: On 8th September, 2023, the Department of Business Administration of The Bhawanipur Education Society College conducted an Industrial Visit to the Amul Macho factory situated in Agarpara, West Bengal. The final year students of the Business Administration department were taken for the Visit, organised by Departmental Coordinator, Dr. Tridib Sengupta. Though it was officially an industrial visit, the true purpose was much deeper. Not only did we visit the factory but also learn about the



functioning of the entire unit.

Amul Macho is a well-known producer of inner wear in India, and it currently holds the tenth position in the garment industry. They have two units in Agarpara where the men's garments are made from scratch. It has gained immense expertise in the supplying and trading of gent's undergarments, T-shirt, pants, etc. The unit has a capacity to produce approximately 24,000 units per day, with a direct employment of about 1000-1200 workers, inclusive of both male and female.

The Amul Macho products sold in the markets are made from scratch through inclusion of several processes consecutively that give out the finished product of the best quality.

A group consisting of 43 marketing students including a student- reporter and a student photographer visited the site. The students accompanied by the class coordinator Prof. Jayjit Chakraborty started the trip at 10:50 a.m. and reached the site at around 12:50p.m. Students were provided refreshments on their way to the factory by the college. The office staff at the factory welcomed the group warmly and

proceeded to present the workings of the factory and provide a guided tour to the students. Supervisor of each department briefed students about the various steps involved in the garment producing process.

The first process is known as Knitting, which involves creating fabric by interlocking yarns together using knitting machines. Different types of knitting techniques, such as circular knitting or flat knitting, can be used depending on the desired fabric structure. The process starts with selecting the appropriate yarn and setting up the knitting machine with the desired stitch pattern. The machine knits the yarns together to form the fabric. After knitting, the fabric goes through other processes like dyeing, printing, and garment construction.

The next step in the process is to dye the fabrics in required colours. After the Knitting process, the fabric is sent to a vendor, in bulk, for the Dyeing process. The dyed fabric then goes for a quality check. There is a separate testing laboratory in the factory where the colour quality, shrinkage of cloth, tear, stain, creases or defects are inspected manually to provide only



the safest and best quality materials to the consumers. These fabrics are then sent to Cutting section. The factory uses cutting machines made by MORGAN and GERBER and CAD software for the fabrics to be cut to perfection.

The third step is the process of Assimilation and Stitching which involves bringing together various fabric pieces to create a finished garment. First, the fabric pieces are aligned and pinned together according to the garment pattern. Then, skilled workers use sewing machines or hand stitching techniques to stitch the pieces together, following specific stitching guidelines and seam allowances. This process ensures that the garment fits properly and maintains its shape. After stitching, additional steps like pressing, trimming excess threads, and adding finishing touches are carried out to give the garment a polished look. Additionally elastic bands are cut, designed, and attached to the garment of different sizes and qualities based on demand. It is an important step in transforming the fabric into a stylish and wearable garment.

In the final process, after the garments are stitched, they undergo a thorough inspection to check for any defects or inconsistencies in stitching, measurements, or overall appearance. Once the garments pass the inspection, the next step is logo printing. This involves applying the brand's logo or any other designs onto the garments using techniques like screen printing, heat transfer, or embroidery. Finally, the garments are carefully folded, packed, and labelled according to the brand's specifications. This process ensures that the garments are ready for distribution and display, maintaining the brand's image and delivering a high quality product to customers.

Student interaction with the staff from the various departments provided a holistic view of the factory. The visit was quite interactive and informative as they got to know about the various manufacturing processes that go on in garment production. It was an enthralling experience for the students as it will help them to get a foothold in the corporate world. A token of appreciation in the form of a Memento was presented to the Factory Manager of Amul Macho, Agarpara. Altogether, the visit to the Amul Macho factory was a remarkable experience.

- Outcome of the Activity: It provided an insight into the work life at Amul Macho Factory, where female workers were given prominence than their male counterparts.

## 2. Name of the Activity: Industrial Visit to PepsiCo.

- Objective of the Activity: To sensitize students about processing and packaging of products.



- **Brief Description of the Activity:** On 7th of October 2023, the Department of Business Administration of The Bhawanipur Education Society College conducted an Industrial Visit to the Pepsi Company franchisee factory (Varun Beverages Pvt. Ltd - the flagship of the RKG group) located at Kamalgazi, West Bengal. The students of BBA (Hons.), Third Year batch, were taken for the Visit, organised by the head of Department Coordinator Professor Dr. Tridib Sengupta. Though it was officially an industrial visit, the true purpose was much deeper, not only did we visit the factory, we also learnt about the processing and various packaging of products.

PepsiCo entered India in 1989 and has grown to become one of the largest MNC food and beverage businesses in India.

Gurgaon is home to Varun Beverages' corporate headquarters. There are 11 of them located both inside and outside of India, with Kolkata being the third-largest. Others can be found in Nepal, Sri Lanka, Rajasthan, Goa, Noida, and Guwahati. For beverage producers PepsiCo., Varun Beverages Limited offers bottling and distribution services.

The company Pepsi manufactures and advertises carbonated and non-carbonated soft drinks, as well as packaged drinking water. The company's beverage portfolio also includes 7UP, Miranda, and Mountain Dew brands; reduced calorie drinks like Diet Pepsi; hydrating and nutritional beverages like Aquafina drinking water; and juice-based drinks including Tropicana, Slice, and Twister. The company also sells local soda brands.

A group of 47 HR and Finance DSE students including a reporter and a photographer visited the site. The students, accompanied by the class coordinators Prof. Paridhi Agarwal and Pritha

Chandra, started the trip at 10:30 am. in the morning, and reached the site at around 11:30 am. Breakfast was provided on the way to the site.

Once we reached the company's staff greeted us warmly and introduced us to the senior Plant Manager, Assistant Manager, HR heads, and others. The manufacturing site was well-kept and clean. They provided us with small refreshments, as well as Pepsi, Sprite, and Miranda. They showed us a presentation which included all aspects of the organization such as HR, Finance, and Marketing, and the other history about the company. We were made to wear caps on our head for safety and hygiene purposes before entering the production unit. We learned more about Pepsi Co. as we explored the production site. Pepsi Co.'s soft drink brands include

Mountain Dew, 7UP, Pepsi, Slice, and Nimbooz. Varun drinks has a sales turnover of roughly 600 crores.

The Pepsi Co. sources its ingredients from 12 nations throughout the world, one of which being India. Varun Beverages' raw materials are sourced from China. PepsiCo. is currently ranked second in India in terms of soft drink market share. 90% of the soft drink's contents are water, with the rest being sugar syrup and other ingredients. The unit has 6 production lines each for carbonated, non-carbonated, pet bottle and aquafine filling. Every line has different temperature requirements hence different machines for cleaning, filling, labelling, date coding, seal checking and stacking.

Student interaction with the staff from the various departments provided a holistic view of the factory. The visit was quite interactive and informative as they got to know about the



various processes that go on in a beverage production. It was an enthralling experience for the students as it will help them to get a foothold in the corporate world. A token of appreciation in the form of a Memento was presented to the Factory Manager. Altogether, the visit to the Pepsi Co. Kamalgazi was a remarkable experience.

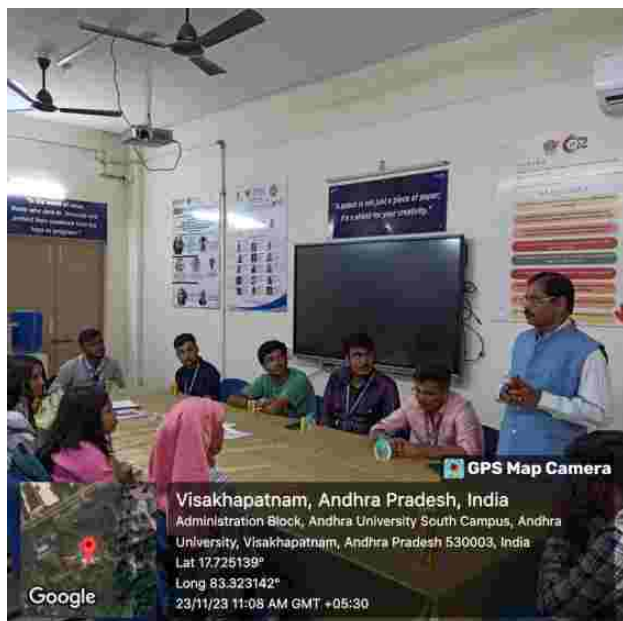

### INFRASTRUCTURE DURING THE ACADEMIC SESSION JULY 2023 - JUNE 2024

Infrastructure plays an important role in the education sector. Classroom design, auditoriums, laboratories, campus area etc. are crucial elements of a learning environment. The high-quality infrastructure facilitates better instruction, improves student outcomes, and reduces dropout rates, among other benefits. The institution offers undergraduate Honours programmes in Arts, Commerce, Management and Science, as well as postgraduate courses in English and Commerce. It also runs several career-oriented courses like Commerce+, Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), Certified Financial Planner (CFP), Corporate Communications, Capital Market, Cyber Security and Global Management Skills, which takes students beyond the rigid framework of a syllabus and provides holistic development for students. In order to ensure the smooth running of all these programmes and

courses the institution has a structured policy for augmentation, replacement and maintenance of infrastructure by a dedicated team of maintenance staff. The policy ensures that- that the academic infrastructure of the College vis a vis its current requirements are assessed regularly and steps are taken to correct any deficiencies or imbalances, proper maintenance and upgradation of all laboratories is conducted regularly, new books, journals and periodicals are added to the library every year according to the needs of the students and the teachers. resources which are available from Government bodies like UGC, DST to improve the laboratories, are garnered and improvements are undertaken to benefit the students. At present the campus area is 16894 sq m with 72 WiFi/ LAN enabled smart classrooms, 32 well equipped laboratories, 7 Computer Labs and 7 ICT-enabled Seminar Halls.

### KNOWLEDGE RESOURCE CENTRE (COLLEGE LIBRARY) DURING THE ACADEMIC SESSION JULY 2023 - JUNE 2024

#### **Vision Statement:**

The Knowledge Resource Centre aims at providing students with the apparatus and environment required for effective study and learning. Through the combination of a supportive environment managed by competent professionals and the best available technology required for utilising digital resources, the Knowledge Resource Centre caters to the multifaceted needs of students, faculty members and the management alike. It harbours the infrastructure for the facilitation of academic excellence.

#### **Library Resource Details:**

As of June 2024, there are 62946 books in the Main Library, 30 magazines, 14 newspapers, 20389 e-journals, 376372 eBooks, subscriptions, and remote access to e-resources such as Capitaline Database, JSTOR, Personal E Library 2.0, Inflibnet Nlist, CMIE Prowess IQ, CMIE Industry Outlook and CMIE Economic Outlook & Turnitin (Plagiarism Software). We have access to books, magazines, DVDs, newspapers, audiobooks, e-books by virtue of the Institutional membership of the British Council Library.

#### **Student Footfall Statistics:**

The total number of working days from January 2024 to June 2024 were 129. The number of students who visited the library in this period was 34684. The highest number of students' footfall in this period was in the month of January 2024 (6594). In this period, 25838 books were issued, 28990 books

were returned, and 9153 books were re-issued. The total number of teachers' and staff's footfall in this period was 886. 378 books were issued by the teachers and staff members in this period, 386 books were returned, and 34 books were re-issued.

#### **Library Services and Facilities:**

The Knowledge Resource Centre remains open for six days a week from Monday to Saturday from 8.00 am to 8.00 pm. It provides paperless issue, return and re-issue of books, journals and magazines. It is equipped with ten Wi-fi enabled computers for the use of the students where they can access e-resources and other relevant data. OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) facility is also made available to the students. The students also have access to JSTOR, Pearson eBooks, Capitaline Database, CMIE Prowess IQ, CMIE Industry Outlook and CMIE Economic Outlook. The Institutional Repository section on the library website is made available to teachers and students where they can access the syllabus and previous years' question papers. A separate computer and separate tables are allocated for the use of the teachers. The Knowledge Resource Centre also organizes workshops and cultural activities for the students and faculty

### STRENGTHS AND CHALLENGES

#### Strengths:

- The college enjoys a prime location in South Calcutta, with excellent connectivity via the Metro-rail network.
- The management is forward-thinking, placing equal emphasis on both academic growth and infrastructural development.
- A distinct educational philosophy guides the institution, aiming to shape students into responsible citizens committed to social welfare.
- The culturally diverse student body promotes strong moral values, particularly in relation to culture and society.
- The academic atmosphere is enriched by a dedicated, experienced faculty.
- Strict discipline is enforced for both students and staff, ensuring an uninterrupted academic calendar, unlike many other higher education institutions in India.
- Regular assessments through class tests, CIAs, assignments, and presentations help in identifying slow learners and implementing remedial measures.
- The campus is a healthy, ragging-free environment that allows students to focus on academics without disruption.
- The Knowledge Resource Centre (Library) employs a unique e-management system, offering structured access to resources such as question papers, e-resources, SWAYAM, UGC MOOC, NPTEL, JSTOR, PEARSON E-LIBRARY, and faculty research papers.
- Both students and faculty frequently utilize the library, resulting in a high footfall.
- The NSS and NCC wings are active throughout the year, promoting civic engagement.
- The college has been ISO certified since 2020.
- The management, particularly through the IQAC and Infrastructure Departments, is committed to green auditing and eco-friendly initiatives, such as campus farming, tree planting, and biodiversity management.
- Nature camps to areas rich in untapped natural resources are organized to increase students' environmental awareness and understanding of the human-nature relationship.
- The college features state-of-the-art facilities, including a sports complex, auditorium, theater hall, and a modern refreshment area.
- Continuous upgrades to labs and infrastructure ensure effective teaching and learning practices.
- The college actively supports and sponsors seminars, workshops, FDPs, and lectures on national and international platforms to enhance research capabilities for both faculty and students.
- Students are encouraged to participate in a variety of curricular and co-curricular activities, which foster the development of analytical skills.
- The institution adopts a holistic approach to student development, prioritizing both academic success and extracurricular engagement.

- Regular student mentoring is a standard practice.
- The placement cell is highly active, providing various soft skill development courses and diplomas designed to enhance employability and meet global job market demands.

### **Challenges:**

- Campus expansion is urgently required to accommodate the growing needs of the institution.
- There is inadequate financial support from state and central governments for research projects at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels.
- The curriculum needs to be more innovative, incorporating methods like video lectures, model experiments, posters, and review papers to encourage novel student projects.
- State and central government funding for curriculum and infrastructure development, as well as for the introduction of more skill-based programs, is insufficient.
- A lack of outdoor sports facilities has led to reduced student participation, despite the known benefits of sports in promoting discipline and focus.
- The placement cell requires further resources and stronger networks across professional sectors to enhance job opportunities for students.
- Limited green spaces on campus contribute to a higher carbon footprint, highlighting the need for more energy-efficient solutions.
- Faculty face challenges in completing the syllabus within the limited time constraints imposed by the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) and NEP-CCF.

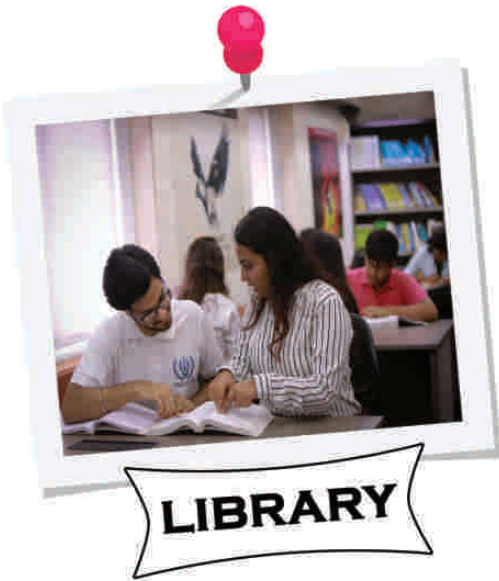
